Quadruple My Love Tea Towel

Happy New Year! Thank you for enrolling in the Mastering Your Machine for the HV Designer EPIC 2 and Designer EPIC Club. In our class this month we will continue our exploration and review of the top features within our Top-of-the-Line Husqvarna Viking Designer sewing and embroidery machines. Our project will use the Design Shaping feature and the built-in fonts to create a unique design which could be placed on a tea towel or perhaps stitched out on fabric to make a pillow. The creative design possibilities with this wonderful machine are limitless. This project will be finished before Valentine's Day so you will have time to enjoy using this towel or gifting it to someone special.



Supplies

Husqvarna Viking Designer EPIC 2 or Designer EPIC Sewing and Embroidery Machine, single hole stitch plates, Foot Control Pedal, Power Cord; 260 mm x 200 mm hoop

Machine Feet: Sensor Q foot

Rubber Tipped Stylus recommended for programming.

Embroidery Needle, Size 80 (**Available for purchase at Patty's**)

Inspira Aqua Magic Wash Away Stabilizer (**Available for purchase at Patty's**)

Premade tea towel or fabric to stitch the design on.

40 wt. embroidery thread to stitch the design. (Thread color selection of your choice. I used the same color thread for all of the hearts and lettering. The original heart design used 2 colors of thread, one to outline the heart and another to stitch the inside of the heart.)

Embroidery bobbin thread (I used a 60-wt. thread to match the background color of the towel.)

General Sewing Supplies: 18" long ruler, pins, snips, non-permanent marking pen, seam ripper, scissors

Single heart design used in the project will be provided in class.

Preparation and Cutting Instructions before Class:

Prewash and dry the towel. Starch the towel (if using a woven towel).

If you elect to use fabric for this project- recommend starching the fabric. If you are going to make a pillow from the fabric, I would suggest you also fuse a fusible woven interfacing, such as Pellow SF 101, to the back of the fabric.
