

SAGUACHE RECEIVES NATIONAL ATTENTION

The Saguache Crescent, Thursday, August 25, 2016 - On Saturday, July 30, 2016 the Town of Saguache was featured at the National Alliance of Preservations Commissions (NAPC) biennial conference in Mobile, Alabama in a session entitled "How to Build a Preservation Ethic in Your Community."

NAPC is a 501 (c) (3) non-profit corporation with a mission to educate, advocate on behalf of, and train the nation's historic preservation commissions. The Saguache Historic Preservation Commission was created by ordinance of the Town Board in 2009.

"Saguache's story was the starter, the appetizer if you will, for the session," stated session manager, Dan Corson, recently retired intergovernmental services director in History Colorado's office of Archaeology and Historic Preservation. "The town has already received state recognition and I was excited to take its efforts to a national audience.
