

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE

ORDINANCE NO. 14

- Sec. 1. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Alexandria that it shall be unlawful for all horses, mules, cattle, goats, sheep, or swine or any such animals to run at large within the platted part of the Town of Alexandria.
- Sec. 2. The owner or person having charge of any horses, mules, cattle, goats, sheep, or swine or any such animals, who shall suffer them, or any one of them, to run at large within the platted part of said Town of Alexandria, shall, upon conviction thereof before the Justice of the Peace of said Town, be fined not more than ten dollars or less then one dollar and costs of prosecution for each offense.
- Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the Marshall whenever he shall find any horses, mules, cattle, goats, sheep or swine, or any such animals or any of them, running at large within the platted part of the Town of Alexandria or that shall have been taken up by any person upon whose premises such animal or animals may be trespassing to take and safely keep the same and bring the owner or person having charge of such animal or animals forthwith before the Justice of the Peace, of said Town, to answer to the charge of having violated the provision of this Ordinance.
- Sec. 4. Whenever the fine and cost imposed for violation of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall not be promptly paid, the animal or animal taken up shall be disposed of the payment of said fine and costs as provided in Section 751 of the Code of Civil Procedure.
