

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING WHAT ARE NUISANCES AND PROVIDING FOR AND ABATEMENT THEREOF AND PENALTIES THEREFORE

ORDINANCE NO. 165

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria:

- Sec. 1. Each and every act and neglect hereinafter forbidden is hereby declared a nuisance.
- Sec. 2. No person shall in this City keep or maintain within 75 yards of any dwelling house occupied by any human being other than himself or members of his family any live cattle, sheep, pigs or goats.
- Sec. 3. No person shall in this City cause, permit or suffer any premises in this City of which he is the owner of which he has the possession to become offensive or unwholesome either by causing or permitting any offensive or unwholesome substance, manure, weeds or junk to remain thereon as to become offensive or unwholesome or dangerous to the neighborhood.
- Sec. 4. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars and not more than one hundred dollars.
- Sec. 5. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
