

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PLACING, LEAVING OR KEEPING UPON ANY STREET, ALLEY, ROAD, OR SIDEWALK OR ANY PUBLIC GROUNDS, ANY VEHICLE OR OTHER OBSTRUCTION, AND PROVIDING FOR THE REMOVAL AT THE EXPENSE OF THE PERSON SO LEAVING THE SAME, AND PROVIDING PENALTY FOR VIOLATION THEREOF.

ORDINANCE NO. 174

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria:

- Sec. 1. No person shall place, leave or keep on any street, road, alley, sidewalk, or any other public ground, any vehicle, farm machinery, trailer, motor vehicle or other obstruction, except when the same shall be in actual use as provided by traffic ordinances, which may obstruct the removal of snow from the public streets.
- Sec. 2. Provided that any vehicle or other obstruction so left placed or kept in violation of the foregoing section, the same shall be removed from the street by the police department and the person so owning the vehicle shall be required to pay the expenses of such removal plus a Five Dollar (\$5.00) towing charge. The same shall be paid before the said person shall be able to repossess the said property so removed.
- Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of the foregoing Ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not more then Thirty Days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.
