

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO CARDS, DICE, DOMINOES, CHECKERS, AND ALL LIKE GAMES

ORDINANCE NO. 27

The City Council of the City of Alexandria, S. D., do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons holding license from the City of Alexandria, to sell intoxicating liquors or who keep for hire, gain or reward any billiard or pool tables or any other ball game, to permit any person or persons to play any other like games in the same building or room adjoining or adjacent thereto used for the sale of intoxicating liquors or where any billiard or pool table or other ball games are kept for hire, gain or reward. Any person or persons violating Sec. 1 of this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon trial and conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than nor more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars and costs of suit or prosecution and shall be at once committed to the County Jail until the same be paid not exceeding ten (10) days.
- Sec. 2. If any person or persons shall play at cards, dice, dominoes, checkers or any like game in any place where intoxicating liquors are licensed to be sold, or in any room or building adjoining or adjacent thereto, or in any room or building licensed for the gain or reward or in any room or building adjoining or adjacent thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon trial and conviction thereof shall be subject to a fine of not less than five (\$5.00) nor more than twenty five (\$25.00) dollars and cost of suit or prosecution and shall be at once committed to the County Jail until the same be paid.

This Ordinance shall take effect on and after the first day of April, A.D. 1887.
