

WHEREAS, the City of Alexandria has adopted an ordinance regulating the sale, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages in the city street rights of way; and

WHEREAS, it would be in the best interest of the taxpayers and residents of the City to amend such ordinance; now, therefore,

It was moved by Weber, and seconded by Blankenship, that the following Ordinance be adopted:

ORDINANCE NO. 301  
AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE #235, AND PERTAINING TO THE  
POSSESSION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES FOR CONSUMPTION UPON THE  
PUBLIC STREETS OF ALEXANDRIA.

BE IT ORDAINED by the common Council of the City of Alexandria, S.D. that:

1. Ordinance #235 shall be amended as is set forth herein;
2. That Section 4 shall be amended to provide for a maximum fine of Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars for a violation thereof.
3. That Section 4 shall be renumbered as Section 5.
4. That the following shall be inserted as the new Section 4:

Section 4. Exception. Alcoholic beverages may be sold for consumption, possessed for consumption and consumed on Main Street when the following conditions are met:

- (a) The exception only applied to the times and areas covered by the “street dance”, if one is issued, and any supporting temporary alcoholic beverage license.
- (b) The exception shall not apply to more of main street than the portion between 3<sup>rd</sup> street and 6<sup>th</sup> street.
