

ORDINANCE NO. 32

The City Council of the City of Alexandria do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1. That any person not an officer of the law who shall in the City of Alexandria carry concealed about his person any fire arms, sling-shot, sheath, or dirk-knife, brass knuckles, or any other weapons which when used is likely to produce death or do great bodily harm; or who shall draw a pistol, revolver, knife, or other dangerous or deadly weapon upon another, shall upon convictions thereof be fined in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.
- Sec. 2. That nay person who shall in the City of Alexandria, disturb the peace of the City, or any lawful assemble of persons, or if any neighborhood family, person or persons, or who shall curse, swear, quarrel or use violent, threatening, vulgar, obscene, or indecent language in the streets or other public place, or make any great noise so as to disturb the peace of any person or neighborhood, shall upon conviction thereof be fined in a sum of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars.
- Sec. 3. That any person who shall in the City of Alexandria be found in a state of intoxication or drunkenness in a public place shall be fined in a sum not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars.
- Sec. 4. That in cases where any fine is imposed upon any person under the provisions of any section of this ordinance, the costs of the prosecution shall be assessed to the person fined and collected in the same manner as such fine.
- Sec. 5. That in all cases where any fines are imposed upon any person under the provisions of this ordinance, or under the provisions of any ordinance, now or which shall hereafter be in force in said city, the person so fined shall be committed to prison at hard labor under the custody of the City Marshall until such fine and costs of prosecution shall be paid, provided that for each day which said person stands so committed, he shall be allowed one and seventy five hundredths dollars (\$1.75) which shall be credited upon such fine and costs until the same is fully paid and satisfied.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect upon and after its approval and publication.
