

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE RUNNING OF BILLIARD AND POOL TABLES
WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 36

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria that:

- Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person or persons whomsoever to run or cause to be run any billiards or pool tables without having obtained from the City a license to do so.
- Sec. 2. Such license shall be \$20.00 per annum payable quarterly in advance for each and every billiard or pool table run.
- Sec. 3. Any person violating the provisions of the above sections shall be fined a sum of not less than \$25.00 or more than \$100.00 or imprisoned in the County Jail not exceeding 30 days or less than 10 days for each and every offense or both such fine and imprisonment at the discretion of the Court.
- Sec. 4. It shall be the duty of the City Marshall to arrest any person when he knows to be violating the provisions of the above sections or upon the complaint of any person that the same is being violated and take him or them before the Mayor or City Justice for trial.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately after its passage and approval.

All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances conflicting with the provisions of the above sections are hereby repealed.
