

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE AMOUNT OF LICENSE TO BE PAID FOR THE  
PRIVILEGE OF SELLING INTOXICATING LIQUORS AT RETAIL WITHIN THE  
CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 37

The City council of the City of Alexandria do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons, firm, or corporation to engage in the business of selling intoxicating liquors at retail within the corporate limits of the City of Alexandria without first having obtained a license so to do; which license shall be at the rate of \$240.00 per annum, payable quarterly, in advance.
- Sec. 2. Any person, persons, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of the above section shall be subject to all the penalties in such cases made and provided by law.
- Sec. 3. It shall be the duty of the City Marshall to arrest all person whom he knows to be selling intoxicating liquors contrary to above provisions, or when complaint is made to him by competent persons that Section One of this act is being violated and bring them forthwith before the Mayor or Police Justice for trial.
- Sec. 4. This Ordinance shall be deemed in full force and effect from and after its approval and publication.
