

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE POSTING OF ADVERTISING MATTER IN THE
CITY OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 50

The City Council of the City of Alexandria do ordain as follows:

- Sec. 1. No person shall place or fasten upon any sidewalk, railing post, pole or tree on or upon any street, alley or public highway in the City of Alexandria any sign, bill, poster or other advertising matter of any nature whatsoever, or upon any property belonging to said City.
- Sec. 2. No person shall place or fasten upon any private property any sign, bill, poster or other advertising matter of any nature whatsoever, without first having obtained permission from the owner thereof.
- Sec. 3. It shall be unlawful for any person to post any bills, dodgers, signs or other advertising matter for any purpose except farmer's sale bills, church socials and religious services, within the corporate limits of Alexandria, without first obtaining a license so to do from the City Clerk of said City, which license is hereby fixed at five (\$5.00) dollars per annum.
- Sec. 4. Any person violating any provisions of this Ordinance shall be punished by five or not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than twenty-five (\$25.00) and costs of suit, and default of payment thereof, shall be committed to the County Jail of Hanson County not less than ten (10) days nor more than twenty (20) days.
