

ORDINANCE REGULATING USE OF AUTOMOBILES AND MOTOR VEHICLES WITHIN
THE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 57

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria:

- Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any owner or person having in charge any automobile or motor vehicle as defined in Chapter 137 of the South Dakota Session Laws of 1905 to operate such automobile or motor vehicle within the corporate limits of the City of Alexandria at a quarter of speed than one mile in six (6) minutes and when turning a corner at a quarter rate of speed than one mile in seven and one-half (7 ½) minutes.
- Sec. 2. Every vehicle described in Section 1 of this Ordinance must be provided with good and sufficient brakes and also with suitable bell, gong, horn or other signal, which horn, gong, or signal must be sounded upon approaching the intersections of any streets, alley or public highway, and must have one or more lights showing white light, visible within reasonable distance upon the forepart of such vehicle, showing the register number of the vehicle in Arabic numerals, not less than one quarter of an inch in width. Such lamps so provided for must be lighted an hour after sunset and until an hour before sunrise.

Any person convicted of violating the provisions of the Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) or more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or by imprisonment in the County Jail of Hanson County, South Dakota, for not exceeding then (10) days or by both such fine and imprisonment.
