

AN ORDINANCE RELATIVE TO THE CONSTRUCTION, REPAIR AND OBSTRUCTION OF SIDEWALKS

ORDINANCE NO. 6

- Sec. 1. It is hereby ordained by the Board of Trustees of Alexandria, that the Board, whenever they shall deem necessary, may authorize and order, the construction or repairing of any sidewalk on any street, avenue, lane, alley, or highway, in said Town. Such sidewalk shall be constructed under the supervision, and direction of the Board of Trustees on the established grade of the street where the same may be ordered, by and at the expense of the respective owners, of the premises adjoining such walk.
- Sec. 2. All sidewalks, constructed under this ordinance, shall be of the following dimensions, viz: Upon Main Street, said walk shall be eight feet in width, upon all other streets such walks shall be four feet in width. Such walks shall be constructed of said pine, not less than two inches in thickness on Main Street, and not more than eight or less than six inches in width: to be laid upon, nailed, (with twelve penny nails) three sound stringers, not less than six inches in thickness, said stringers to be laid at equal distance apart, and parallel with the street. But the eight foot walks shall have not less than four stringers, in size and dimensions aforesaid.
- Sec.3. All such sidewalks shall be constructed and repaired, in a workman like manner, and whenever the Board determines that a sidewalk shall be constructed, or repaired, under the provisions of this Ordinance, it shall be their duty to cause the owners of the lots, or premises adjoining the proposed sidewalk, to be notified to repair such walk in front of their premises, within such time as shall be required and directed by the Board. Provided, that no sidewalk shall be required to be constructed within less than thirty day, nor repaired in less than three days from the time of giving such notice.
- Sec. 4. Such notice shall be given personally, or by posting the same upon the premises of such owner, adjoining such sidewalks.
- Sec. 5. In case any sidewalk shall not be completed, or repaired, within the time specified in such notice, to the satisfaction of the Board, the Board will then cause to be constructed or repaired such walk, keep an accurate account of all expenses, and add a sum of two dollars and fifty cents for each day in which supervision of the construction or repairing such walk is made.
- Sec. 6. No person shall drive any horse, or other animals, or any wagon, cart or vehicle on any cross walk, not stop, hitch, or detain his or her horse, team, or wagon, or vehicle, on any cross walk, in said Town, so as to obstruct the same under a penalty not exceeding three dollars and costs of prosecution of each offense.
- Sec. 7. This Ordinance shall take effect on the 5th day of November, A.D. 1883.
