

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE PICKETING OF ANIMALS AND PROHIBITING ANIMALS RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 70

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria:

- Sec. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to picket, within the City of Alexandria any horse, mule, cow or other animals in such a manner that such horse, mule, cow or other animal can while so picketed, cross to be in on upon any street, alley or sidewalk.
- Sec. 2. It shall be unlawful for the owner, or person in charge, of any horse, cattle, swine, sheep, goat, or other animal to permit or suffer such animal to permit or suffer such animal to run at large within the City of Alexandria.
- Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions contained in Sections 1 or 2 of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof pay a fine or not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$100.00.
- Sec. 4. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
