

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE OPERATING OF MOTOR AND ANIMAL DRAWN VEHICLES ON THE MAIN STREET OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 77

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria in the State of South Dakota:

- Sec. 1. That every person driving or operating any motor or animal drawn vehicle on any of the streets or highways with the boundary of this City shall keep to the right hand of such street or highway as close as possible to the curb, and shall stop the same only on the side of such streets to the right hand of such driver, with the front end of such vehicle pointing toward the curb at an angle of about 45 degrees.
- Sec. 2. Every person driving or operating such vehicle on the streets of this City and desiring to cross or turn such vehicle around in the street, shall only do so at the far side of the intersection of such street with another.
- Sec. 3. Every person driving or operating any vehicle on the streets of this City in overtaking and passing another vehicle such driver shall pass on the left of such vehicle, and where a motor vehicle shall sound a warning twenty five feet in the rear of the vehicle passed.
- Sec. 4. At a distance not greater than fifty feet nor less than twenty five feet before crossing any intersection street, the person operating any motor drawn vehicle shall sound a suitable and adequate bell, horn to other device for signaling.
- Sec. 5. Any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each and every offense, or by imprisonment in the Hanson County Jail for not less than 10 days or more than 30 days.
- Sec. 6. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
