

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE RUNNING OF BILIARD AND POOL TABLES
WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF ALEXANDRIA

ORDINANCE NO. 93

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Alexandria:

- Sec. 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, or person whoever to run or cause to be run any billiard or pool tables for gain or profit within the City of Alexandria without first having obtained from the City of Alexandria the license to do so.
- Sec. 2. Such license shall be twelve dollars (\$12.00) per annum for each and every billiard or pool table run and shall be payable quarterly in advance.
- Sec. 3. Any person violating any of the provisions of the above section shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars or imprisonment not exceeding thirty days nor less than ten days for each and every offense.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and approval.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.
