Cut Square Once Diagonally


Cut Square Twice Diagonally

PLEASE NOTE: The block features (4) different fabrics for C squares. Plan the quantity of fabrics you wish to use for the center of the block and adjust the $C$ square cutting instructions accordingly.

| A | (2) 3 1/4" squares; cut the squares once diagonally to make (4) A triangles. (Please note: triangles are cut oversized to allow for trimming.) |
| :---: | :---: |
| B | (3) $51 / 4$ " squares; cut the squares twice diagonally to make (12) B triangles. (Please note: triangles are cut oversized to allow for trimming.) |
| C | (25) $21 / 2$ " squares. |

Assembly

1. Arrange $C$ squares diagonally as shown in a $4 \times 4$ grid. If using more than (2) fabrics, aim for even color and print distribution.
2. Next, place $B$ triangles around the perimeter of the block as setting triangles so that the longest edges of each triangle will create the outside edges of the block. Place A triangles at the four corners of the block as shown.
3. Begin sewing the block together in diagonal rows, alternating the direction in which you press the seams in each row. Sew diagonal rows together to complete block assembly.
4. Trim the block to measure $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ ensuring that there is at least a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance around all edges. The block is designed to float a bit, so there might be as much as $3 / 8^{\prime \prime}-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ from the point of the $C$ squares to the edge of the block. Press to complete.
