

## City Tiles Quilt Supply List

City Tiles is a great quilt because you can do everything from yardage to scrappy fabric. The blocks can be made in either 18" or 12" size. It is Fat Eighth and Fat Quarter friendly. There are lots of options for this quilt!!! This is a fun class with prize drawings throughout to keep you going, and lots of beautiful blocks. If you are an Instagram (IG) follower, there are over 1,000 examples of this popular quilt under the hashtag #citytilesquilt. If you don't have an IG account, ask a kiddo to pull up this hashtag for you 😊

### Quilt Size

For the 18" block size, you make 16 blocks total, in a 4x4 layout. The quilt finishes 72"x72".

For the 12" block size, you make 30 blocks total, in a 5x6 layout. The quilt finishes 60"x72".

### Yardage

For the main part of the tiles you will need assorted Fat Eighths (16 for the 18" block, 10 for the 12" block) or scraps totaling this amount.

The outline of each tile can be from solid yardage (1-2/3 yards for both sizes) or assorted Indigo Fat Quarters (8 for the 18" block, 10 for the 12" block).

The corner squares require 5/8 yard for the 18" block size and 1/2 yard for the 12" block. The corner squares are optional for the 12" block.

The background requires 2-1/4 yards for both the 18" and 12" block sizes.

Binding for the 18" block quilt requires 5/8 yard, the 12" block quilt requires 1/2 yard.

### Seam Allowance - IMPORTANT

There are lots of seams in this block. It is important to have an accurate 1/4" seam allowance coming into this quilt. To check your seam allowance, accurately cut 3 pieces of scrap fabric 1.5" x 5". Seam together along the LONG edges and press. This pattern suggests pressing all seams open. Measure across your 3 strips, it should measure 3.5". If you are not spot on, adjust your seam allowance and repeat the cutting and sewing steps above until you are. Even if you are only off 1/16", this amount will add up across your block, and your seams and blocks will not match up.

### Other

Other than the above, you will only need customary sewing supplies, needles, thread, seam ripper, snips/scissors, small ruler, sewing machine in good working order with a quarter inch foot or guide, and any chocolate or snacks you need to keep you going 😊 Cutting mats, ironing boards and irons are in each classroom, supplied by the Quilt Festival.
