## Fabric Requirements (51" x 23" Quilt):

| <input type="checkbox"/> Background Fabric (blocks)  | 1 yard      |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Flower Petals Fabric        | 1/2 yard    |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Flower Centers Fabric       | 1/4 yard    |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Backing Fabric              | 1-3/4 yards |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Binding Fabric              | 1/2 yard    |
| <input type="checkbox"/> Batting                     | 30" x 58"   |

## Supplies:

- Iron (a small craft or travel iron works well)
- Pressing mat and an old towel; hot iron cleaner
- Spray Starch
- Mary Ellen's Best Press (the Best Press is optional, but I find it useful)
- Freezer Paper (one roll)
- Appliqué Pressing Sheet or Parchment Paper
- Template Plastic (1 sheet)
- Marking Pen or Pencil and Sharpie Marker
- Cuticle stick and Q-Tips (or a Small Paintbrush)
- Roxanne's Glue-Baste-It or Water-Soluble Fabric Glue Marker
- Sulky's Totally Stable Iron-on, Tear-Away Stabilizer
- Sewing Machine (including power cord, pedal & instruction book)
- Scissors (for paper and fabric); small embroidery scissors
- Pinking Shears (Optional)
- Thread(s) for Piecing and Machine Appliqué
- Straight Pins; Seam Ripper
- Rotary cutting equipment (cutter, mat, acrylic ruler, etc.); a large square (14"x14" or larger) is great for squaring up the blocks.

## Pre-Class Preparations and Cutting Instructions

Prior to class, please cut the following:

- Cut three (3) 14" x 14" squares from your background fabric
- Cut four (4) 1-1/2" strips from your inner border/sashing fabric (along the crosswise grain)
- Cut three (3) 4-1/2" strips from your inner border/sashing fabric (along the lengthwise grain)
- Cut three (3) 13-1/2" squares from the freezer paper

Bring all remaining fabric and freezer paper to class.

Note: If you wish to make this quilt using fusing for the appliqué, please be sure to bring 1-2 yards of a fusible web product to class with you. (My personal favorite is the original, lighter-weight Wonder Under.)

In addition to my original pattern needed for the class, I will have template plastic, Sulky's Totally Stable, fabric glue pens, and Roxanne's Glue-Baste-It available for purchase.
