

# FISH ON

## Supply List

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Come experience a new way of improvisational piecing by designing your own school of fish. In this class you will learn this easy free piecing technique of making fish your way. No need for patterns, templates or measuring in this creative style of quilting. This will be a fun, relaxing class where you will enjoy surprisingly fast results. The quilt can be made any size from a small wall hanging to king size. Fabric amounts will vary greatly. Fabric amounts will vary greatly from fish to fish and quilt to quilt. Each fish is designed individually by YOU!

### **Pattern will be provided in class**

#### **Fabric:**

Bring a selection of fabrics in contrasting values and colors. You can use fat or straight quarters and smaller pieces including brights, stripes, geometrics, tone on tones. Think of textures and colors for the fish body, fish head and fins. You will probably want at least 15 to 20 different fabrics minimum for your fish. Don't forget to check your stash. For backgrounds, I used many different solid type cottons, but the background fabrics can be any fabrics you choose. You will need approximately ¼ yard of background fabric for every 2-3 fish. Sashing will require extra fabric. Contrast is more important than color. If you are pulling scraps from your stash, you will need pieces no smaller than 3"x7" for the fish body. Smaller pieces will work great for the tail, head, and fins.

#### **Other Supplies:**

- Sewing Machine in good working order
- Thread for piecing
- Basic sewing kit to include: Rotary cutter, small cutting mat, ruler, scissors (large and small), pins, seam ripper
