What's Next....?






A lot of us in book club are still waiting to listen to this title through our local libraries. It has really good reviews and worth an honorable mention....

GREAT PLACES FOR BOOKS:

We have equal numbers that prefer audio vs physical books and older books may not yet be available in audio format. Libby is the easiest app, but we often have lengthy waits. You can use your library card for "regional" use, which can open your reach to additional, possibly larger libraries. Check out your library to see if you have regional or even statewide options. Hoopla is another app that will lend you ever more titles, and all you need is a library card!

Other options are PangoBooks, Thriftbooks, Halfprice, Amazon Used books, <u>Kindle</u> and <u>Audible</u>.

It is true many book groups have the primary purpose of exploring all genres which results in stretching our literary experience with new authors and stimulating points of view; often with books we would not pick otherwise. This is not that kind of book club. We all seem to have similar taste and enjoy a good book that shares information while entertaining us.
