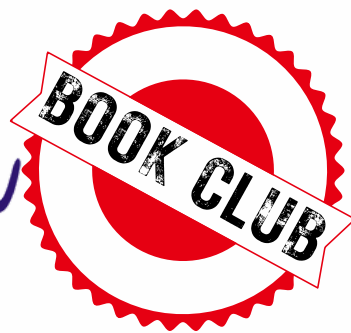

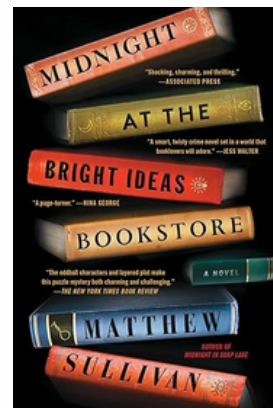


## The Fabric Friends Book Club

Join us every 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday at 11am PST LIVE on YouTube to talk about the book club title.

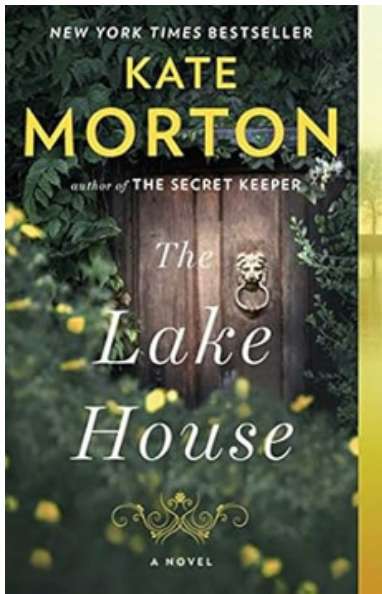

# Titles for the month:

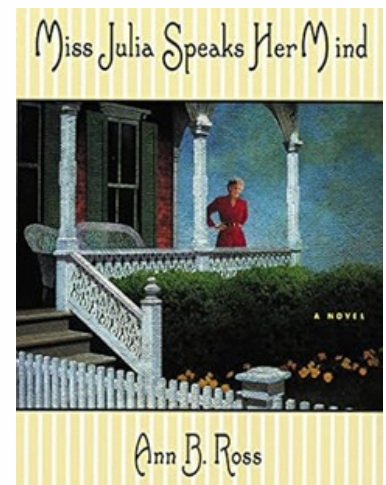
## **The Lake House by Kate Morton**



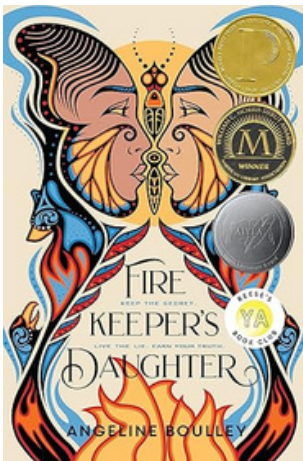
Living on her family's idyllic lakeside estate in Cornwall, England, Alice Edevane is a bright, inquisitive, and precociously talented sixteen-year-old who loves to write stories. One midsummer's eve, after a beautiful party drawing hundreds of guests to the estate has ended, the Edevanes discover that their youngest child, eleven-month-old Theo, has vanished without a trace. He is never found, and the family is torn apart, the house abandoned. Decades later, Alice is living in London, having enjoyed a long successful career as a novelist. Miles away, Sadie Sparrow, a young detective in the London police force, is staying at her grandfather's house in Cornwall. While out walking one day, she stumbles upon the old Edevane estate—now crumbling and covered with vines. Her curiosity is sparked, setting off a series of events that will bring her and Alice together and reveal shocking truths about a past long gone...yet more present than ever.

## **Fire Keeper's Daughter by Angeline Boulley**



Eighteen-year-old Daunis Fontaine has never quite fit in, both in her hometown and on the nearby Ojibwe reservation. She dreams of a fresh start at college, but when family tragedy strikes, Daunis puts her future on hold to look after her fragile mother. The only bright spot is meeting Jamie, the charming new recruit on her brother Levi's hockey team. Yet even as Daunis falls for Jamie, she senses the dashing hockey star is hiding something. Everything comes to light when Daunis witnesses a shocking murder, thrusting her into an FBI investigation of a lethal new drug. Reluctantly, Daunis agrees to go undercover, drawing on her knowledge of chemistry and Ojibwe traditional medicine to track down the source. But the search for truth is more complicated than Daunis imagined, exposing secrets and old scars. At the same time, she grows concerned with an investigation that seems more focused on punishing the offenders than protecting the victims.

## GREAT PLACES FOR BOOKS:

We have equal numbers that prefer audio vs physical books and older books may not yet be available in audio format. Libby is the easiest app, but we often have lengthy waits. You can use your library card for “regional” use, which can open your reach to additional, possibly larger libraries. Check out your library to see if you have regional or even statewide options. Hoopla is another app that will lend you ever more titles, and all you need is a library card!

Other options are PangoBooks, Thriftbooks, Halfprice, Amazon Used books, Kindle and Audible.

It is true many book groups have the primary purpose of exploring all genres which results in stretching our literary experience with new authors and stimulating points of view; often with books we would not pick otherwise. This is not that kind of book club. We all seem to have similar taste and enjoy a good book that shares information while entertaining us. Suspense, intrigue, surprise, emotion, laughter and even tears are OK but our goal is five 5 star reads, every time! Life is too short to suffer through a bad book!
