


## CHRISTMAS STOCKING DIRECTIONS



Stocking panels are terrific options, because you just have to cut out the printed stocking. If you'd like to start from scratch, enlarge this template 250% (or find a stocking shape you like from an existing stocking in your decorations). You will need a matching size and shape, and two 'reverse' shapes. I find it easiest to cut out all four at the same time. I have my panel and lining right side up, and the back and a lining wrong side up.


1. Make the 'tab'. I cut a 3 1/2" x 5" rectangle and make it into a 3/4" x 5" double fold binding and stitch down both sides.
2. Now lay out your four pieces all right side up.



3. Sew the two lining/back pieces together at the top RST, but tuck the folded tab in first. Put it 1/2" in from the back side.



4. Sew the lining/front pieces together, RST just like the lining.
5. Then stack the two on top of each other, RST. Stitch all the way around, leaving a small opening to turn the stocking right side out. Stitch the hole closed. Stiff the lining inside the stocking. Top stitch around the top.
6. All done!! These work great as gift bags for the holidays. Big, small, all colors!
