

Drop Zone - Zippered Tray Class Supply List

Class registration policy: All classes must be paid for at the time of registration. If a class is canceled due to a lack of minimum enrollment, the class fee will be refunded. Any cancellation must be made at least 72 hours in advance to receive a refund. Teachers need time to prepare class handouts and supplies. Please register early as possible to ensure your place and to avoid disappointment. Pattern: ByAnnie.com - Drop Zone

Choose a size: small, medium, large or make all three

See the back of the pattern for dimensions of each size and the size of the zippered tray when open and when closed.

Use cotton fabrics: Select three fat quarters, one for the exterior (main), one for the lining (interior) and one of a contrast fabric for grab tabs and side panels.

Back of pattern is referenced below.

ByAnnie Soft and Stable - ½ yard will make all three bags

Fusible Interfacing: - ¼ yard - Pellon Shape Flex

Handbag zippers - #5 nylon - each size requires one 24" or longer single slide zipper. Or, get zipper tape by the yard. You will need two yards and three zipper pulls to make all three sizes

Optional 1" hardware: 1 D-ring or triangle ring or swivel hook

Supplies:

Sewing machine with slide on tray and knee lift

90-14 top stitch needle and thread to match fabrics

Zipper Foot, ¼" foot

Stiletto (I like ByAnnie's stiletto)

Removable marking pens or Clover chalk pens

Wonder clips, rotary cutter, small quilting ruler

Double sided tape - ByAnnie ⅛" wide

2-½" circular ruler - I will bring

Prior to Class: Cut main and lining fabric and soft and stable

See page two of the pattern for the cutting chart.

I suggest the large size for your first Drop Zone.

Follow the cutting chart for the size you are making.

Notice that the cutting is the same for the main fabric, the lining fabric and the soft and stable.

Cut one from main fabric, one from lining fabric and one from soft and stable.

Small: 11 x 11 Medium: 11 x 13w Large: 13 x 16w

dimensions are height x width

Note: Using directional fabrics: To ensure that the design is upright on each side of the bag, adjustments must be made when cutting the body pieces. Rather than cutting one piece, cut two pieces from the directional fabric (main and or lining) using the second set of measurements shown in italics on the cutting chart. (page 2)

Then, with right sides together, position the two pieces so that the design is upright on each piece. Sew together along the bottom edge with a ½" seam. Press seam to one side. Proceed with quilting and make sure the seam is centered when you cut the bag body.

Then quilt the pieces. See page 1 of pattern for general quilting instructions.

Place a lining piece wrong side up, place soft and stable on top, and then place the main fabric right side up to make a quilt sandwich. Pin to hold together.

Quilt the pieces. Annie suggests that you quilt straight lines about ¾" to 1" apart vertically from top to bottom. Or quilt diagonal lines.

From the just quilted fabric cut the quilted pieces for the size you have chosen.

Small size: cut 9-¾" x 9-¾"

Medium size: cut 9-¾" x 11-¾"w

Large size: cut 11-¾" x 14-¾"w.

If you pieced directional fabrics, position the seam in the center as you cut.

From coordinating fabric:

Cut two side panels: Small or Medium: 5-¼ x 5-¾ - Large: 6-¼ x 6-¾"

Cut two grab tabs: Small, Medium or Large: 2-½ x 5

From fusible interfacing:

Cut two side panels: Small or Medium: 4-¼ x 4-¾ - Large 5-¼ x 5-¾

Cut two grab tabs: Small, Medium or Large: 2 x 2

Drop Zone

Multipurpose zippered pouches in three sizes open to create shallow trays that provide great visibility and easy access to contents. Use them to store and carry personal items or a variety of art, office, and craft supplies.

Grab tabs make opening and closing easy. The optional hardware on one end may be used to attach a strap or other object.
