

## CLASS SUPPLY LIST

### It's A Cinch

**Class registration policy:** All classes must be paid for at the time of registration. If a class is canceled due to a lack of minimum enrollment, the class fee will be refunded. Please have working knowledge of your machine as the educator will not have time to instruct on the use of your machine.

**Pattern:** ByAnnie.com - It's A Cinch - Choose a size

**Fabric:** small -  $\frac{3}{4}$  yd med. - 1 yd or large -  $1\frac{1}{4}$  yd

You need a main fabric for the inset strip, lining, and straps.

Directional fabric can be used for the main fabric insert.

You could choose a lining fabric that coordinates with the main exterior fabric.

If you select a coordinating fabric for the lining you need a small amount.

Small:  $5\frac{1}{2}$  x 27 Medium: 9 x 42 Large 12 x  $27\frac{1}{2}$

**Mesh:** use ByAnnie mesh - one package that is 18" x 54" or two packages if making the large size

**Interfacing:** Shape Flex SF101, woven fusible interfacing -  $\frac{1}{2}$  yd

**Thread:** select a #40 or #50 polyester thread

Match thread to your fabric and to your mesh color

**Supplies:**

80/12 or 90-14 top stitch needle

Sewing machine with  $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot (slide on tray and knee lift if you have it)

Machine throat plate with small hole for straight stitching

Stiletto (I like ByAnnie's stiletto)

Washout marking pen, Frixion pen, pencil or Clover chalk pens

Wonder clips and pins Rotary cutter and mat

Rulers - a 6 x 24 ruler and a  $12\frac{1}{2}$  and  $16\frac{1}{2}$  square ruler are suggested.

We will have all these rulers in the classroom.

Small iron and pressing mat, a bodkin or large safety pin

25mm (1") bias tape maker - to make drawstrings. I have this.

### **Prior to Class**

**Please cut your fabric, mesh and interfacing using the cutting chart on page 1 of the pattern or see below.**

#### **For the small size**

From your main fabric cut:

Straps 2" x 42" - cut two

Main Insert - 5-1/2" x 27" cut one

Lining 5-1/2" x 27" cut one

Casing 4-1/2" x 27" cut one

From Mesh 6" x 27" - cut two

From Interfacing 3"-1/2 x 27" - cut one for casing

#### **For the medium size**

From your main fabric cut:

Straps 2" x 42" - cut three

Main Insert - 9" x 42" cut one

Lining 9" x 42" cut one

Casing 4-1/2" x 42" cut one

From Mesh 9" x 42" - cut two

From Interfacing 3-1/2" x 42 - cut one for casing

#### **For the large size**

From your main fabric cut:

Straps 2" x 42" - cut three

Main Insert - 6" x 27-1/2" cut two

Lining 6" x 27-1/2" cut two

Casing 4-1/2 x 27-1/2" cut two

From Mesh 12" x 54" - cut one for mesh top

17" X 54" - cut one for mesh bottom

From Interfacing - 3-1/2" x 54" - cut one for casing  
(piece interfacing as needed)

If you wish to add embroidery to the main fabric insert, cut that fabric 2" taller and 2" wider than the dimensions shown. Watch the It's A Cinch add-on video for information on placement of the embroidery design.

# It's A Cinch

Cinch sacks in three handy sizes are extra-easy and fun to make. They are perfect for carrying toys, sports gear, laundry, and more.

Mesh fabric provides ventilation and visibility of contents while fabric strips in the middle add color and interest. These strips provide a perfect spot to embellish the bag with an embroidered name or design.

Sturdy fabric straps pull through the reinforced fabric casing at the top of each bag to cinch it shut. The straps attach to a tab on back for easy carrying over the shoulder or as a backpack.

A hanging strap allows the bag to be hung on a hook or door knob.

Perfect for gifts, the bags can be personalized for each recipient. Choose mesh and fabrics in school or team colors for students or sports fans. Consider using different mesh colors on top and bottom for even more variety.

<b>Main fabric</b> <sup>°</sup> (inset strip and lining, casing, cinch strap, hanging strap, strap tab)	⅝ yard	1 yard	1 ¼ yards
<b>Mesh fabric</b> * SUP209 (top and bottom of bags) <i>*See tip below if making multiple bags</i>	¼ yard	½ yard	1 yard (Two ½-yard packages)
<b>Fusible interfacing</b> * SUP179 (stabilizer for casing)	¼ yard	½ yard	½ yard
<b>Thread</b> to match main and mesh fabrics	SoFine! #50 Superior Threads' 50-wt polyester thread		

<sup>°</sup>Quilting cotton fabric was used for the models on the cover, but other fabrics such as rip-stop nylon or polyester boardshort fabrics may be used for extra durability and water resistance.

\*Mesh fabric and more are available at [www.ByAnnie.com](http://www.ByAnnie.com). **TIP:** If the two pieces needed for the small bag are cut across the width of the mesh, three ½-yard packages will make all three bags: one for the small and the top of the large, one for the medium, and one for the bottom of the large. If you want to mix colors of mesh, refer to the pattern instructions for sizes needed for each bag.
