

Snappy Sleeves Class Supply List

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Quick to sew and perfect for protecting and organizing all kinds of essentials. The sleeves come in two handy formats - horizontal and vertical, each in three sizes. Each features a flap with a snap closure. Use the new ByAnnie Tool Free Snaps. You can make all three sleeves with one yard of main fabric, $\frac{3}{4}$ yard of lining fabric and $\frac{1}{2}$ yard package of soft and stable (18" x 58").

Pattern: ByAnnie.com -Snappy Sleeves

Fabric to make all three sizes

one yard of a main fabric and $\frac{3}{4}$ yard of a lining fabric

Avoid directional fabrics for the first one you make

ByAnnie Soft and Stable - 18" x 58"

Interfacing: fusible woven interfacing - Shape Flex - approx. one yard

ByAnnie Tool-Free Snaps - two packages to make all three sizes will leftovers

Each package comes with 4 full sets of snaps. Colors available are antique brass, black and nickel.

Optional: Vinyl for pocket label - this is provided by the instructor

Bring all essential sewing supplies, and especially include:

Sewing machine slide on try and knee lift if available

90-14 top stitch needle and $\frac{1}{4}$ " presser foot

An edge foot is helpful for stitching in the ditch - Bernina 10

Sharp Awl - needed to make holes for the snaps

ByAnnie's Extra- Sharp Awl is suggested

Stiletto (I like ByAnnie's stiletto)

Thread to match fabrics

Washout marking pen or pencil or Clover chalk pens

Wonder clips and rotary cutter

Small ruler to mark placement lines for the snaps

small iron and pressing mat

2- $\frac{1}{2}$ round circle ruler - I will have this.

Or use the template found in the pattern.

Prior to Class Fabric Quilting and Cutting

Decide if you want a horizontal sleeve or a vertical sleeve or both.

I will be using the medium size horizontal sleeve to demonstrate in class.

You can choose any size.

Follow the cutting and quilting directions on page 2 for the horizontal sleeve or on page 7 for the vertical sleeve.

The quilting is done using the main fabric and soft and stable. No lining fabric is attached.

The pattern recommends quilting straight lines from top to bottom.

Press fabric before you begin and a walking foot is recommended.

The lining fabrics are cut and interfaced in a separate step. See page 2 or 7 for cutting the lining and interfacing. Fuse the interfacing to the wrong side of the lining fabric.

To reduce bulk the interfacing is cut $\frac{1}{2}$ " smaller to keep it out of the seam allowance when it is fused to the lining. When fusing the interfacing center it $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side.

You will be able to sew three or more sleeves in the class if you have quilted your main fabric, cut your lining fabric and interfacing.

Below is the cutting instructions for the **MEDIUM Horizontal size** if you want to go ahead and start preparing:

From main fabric and soft and stable cut one each: $17\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ "h x 10"w.

Quilt the main fabric to the soft and stable (no lining fabric). This is Sleeve Main.

Trim the quilted piece: $16\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ "h x 9"w.

From lining fabric cut one: $10\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ "h x 9"w (horizontal sleeve lining)

cut one: $6\text{-}\frac{5}{8}$ "h x 9"w (horizontal sleeve front lining)

From interfacing cut one: 10" x $8\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ " for sleeve lining

6 $\text{-}\frac{1}{8}$ x $8\text{-}\frac{1}{2}$ for sleeve front lining

Fuse the interacting to the corresponding lining pieces.

Class registration policy: All classes must be paid for at the time of registration. If a class is canceled due to a lack of minimum enrollment, the class fee will be refunded. NOTE: Make all three horizontal or all three vertical sleeves with ¾ yard.			
ByAnnie's Soft and Stable ^{®*} (stabilizer for sleeve, 58" wide) SS1018/SS2018	H: 11½" x 9" V: 6" x 20"	H: 17½" x 10" V: 8" x 22"	H: 15½" x 27" V: 12½" x 32½"
NOTE: Make all three horizontal or all three vertical sleeves with a ½ yard package (18" x 58").			
Fusible interfacing [*] (stabilizer for sleeve lining) SUP179	H or V: ¼ yard	H or V: ⅜ yard	H: ¾ yard V: 1 yard
OPTIONAL: Vinyl [*] (label pocket) SUP151	H or V: 1½" x 2½"	H or V: 1½" x 2½"	H or V: 1½" x 2½"
ByAnnie's Tool-Free Snaps [*] HAR-SN	H or V: One set	H or V: Two sets	H or V: Two sets
Thread to complement fabrics	50 wt polyester thread		

^oBecause of the way these sleeves are constructed, the fabric design will be upside down on the BACK of each sleeve, so choose fabrics accordingly.
