

Zip-N-Grip Class Supply List

The Pattern: [Sewing Pattern with video | The Zip-N-Grip – Sew Yours](#)

Download the pattern instructions and the pattern pieces that begin on page 27. Always print at Actual Size or 100%. Follow the pattern map to help you piece the pattern pieces together. Cut pattern pieces on the lines. Bring to class.

Exterior Fabric: use quilting cotton - $\frac{1}{2}$ - $\frac{3}{4}$ yard

Amount depends on the fabric design or direction

Lining Fabric: use quilting cotton - $\frac{3}{4}$ yard

Use a non directional print or a solid

Interfacing: Shape Flex, Pellon SF101 - $1\frac{1}{2}$ yards or another fusible woven interfacing such as Wovenfuse 1 or Profuse woven fusible interfacing

Stabilizer: Decovil Light, Pellon 525 - $\frac{1}{2}$ yard or more - do not substitute

Zippers: For the main closure - one #5 handbag zipper with one pull - 24" or longer

For the interior divider zipper pocket - one #5 handbag zipper with one pull - 8"

For the lining zipper pocket - one #3 zipper with one pull - 7" long

Hardware: two 1 inch rectangle rings - not optional

Optional: Four rivets or chicago screws - 6-7mm (thin fabrics) or 8-9mm (thick fabrics)

I can provide the rivets if you wish to use them.

Optional: a "handmade" or personal bag tag

Binding: $\frac{1}{2}$ " wide double fold bias binding or use 1" wide fold over elastic - 40" long

Or use a non fraying fabric to make your own binding

Handle and Handle Connectors: Use a lightweight vinyl or cork fabric or use cotton quilting fabric. Approx. 10" x 8" You could use a 1" wide webbing. Approx. 16" long

The sewing notions you need to bring are listed below.

- ☐ **Sewing machine** in good working order with slide on tray and knee lift and bobbins.
- ☐ **Thread to complement fabrics** - use polyester thread #40 weight
- ☐ **Needle:** 90/14 top stitch needle
- ☐ **Presser feet:** a general purpose foot or a $\frac{1}{4}$ " foot. A zipper foot is necessary. If you are using vinyl, a nonstick foot (teflon foot) is helpful.
- ☐ **Small rulers** - example a 3 or 4 inch square or $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 12
- ☐ **Seam ripper** - I use the Bernina seam ripper

- ☐ Wonder clips, sharp scissors and snips
- ☐ Double sided adhesive tape for sewing - 1/8" and 1/4" wide

- ☐ Removable markers for marking - chalk or heat erasable pen (Frixion)
- ☐ Seam roller, a teflon pressing cloth, a lighter, Fray check

For cutting fabrics please bring a medium size cutting mat and rotary cutter. A square ruler such as a 8-1/2 or 12" square is helpful. Pattern weights are needed.
