

Cabo Bucket ps025 replacement of magnetic snap (no longer available) with Snap Hook Set

Step 14-Side Tabs with Swivel Hook Closure: This is what gives the bag it's cute bucket shape! The closure is attached to tabs that are sewn into the seam at the top of the bag, centered over the side seams. When the swivel hook is latched, the tabs pull the sides of the bag inward, creating the bucket shape.

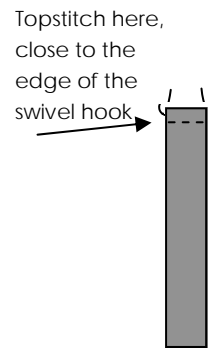
First we need to make the skinny tabs that each attach the swivel hook and mini "D" ring. Begin with the 2" x 4 1/2" piece of fabric and fold it like you did the button loop and the handles, creating a skinny strip 1/2" x 4 1/2" long. There is no PFF in this piece, just the fabric. Sew closed using less than a 1/8" seam, just catching the folds. Slip the end through the slot in the swivel hook and fold to match up the raw edges. Topstitch close to the straight edge of the slot to keep the metal piece from shifting around. See diagram.

Repeat this procedure with the "D" ring. There is no up or down and no right or wrong sides for this hardware. Love those swivel hooks!

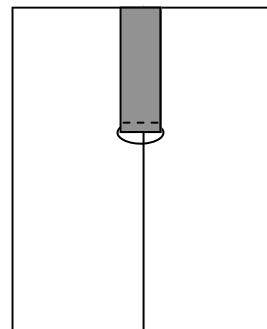
At the side seams of the bag, center the tabs over the side seam and tack in place with a 1/8" seam allowance, raw edges matching the top raw edge of the bag. See diagram at right.
