

Pretty Pumpkin

Supplies:

*1/2 yard of fabric for pumpkin

*6" by 12" of green for leaf and warm and natural for body

*Polyfill to stuff

You will need a glue gun

Optional:

Wood and ribbons

1-Cut out 6 wedges for pumpkin pieces. Run gathering stitches down each side of wedge. Pull threads as desired for the look you want. Once my wedges are gathered I normally try to get them to measure about 7-8 inches each and then begin to pin them together. Placing right sides together and stitch about a quarter inch seam allowance.

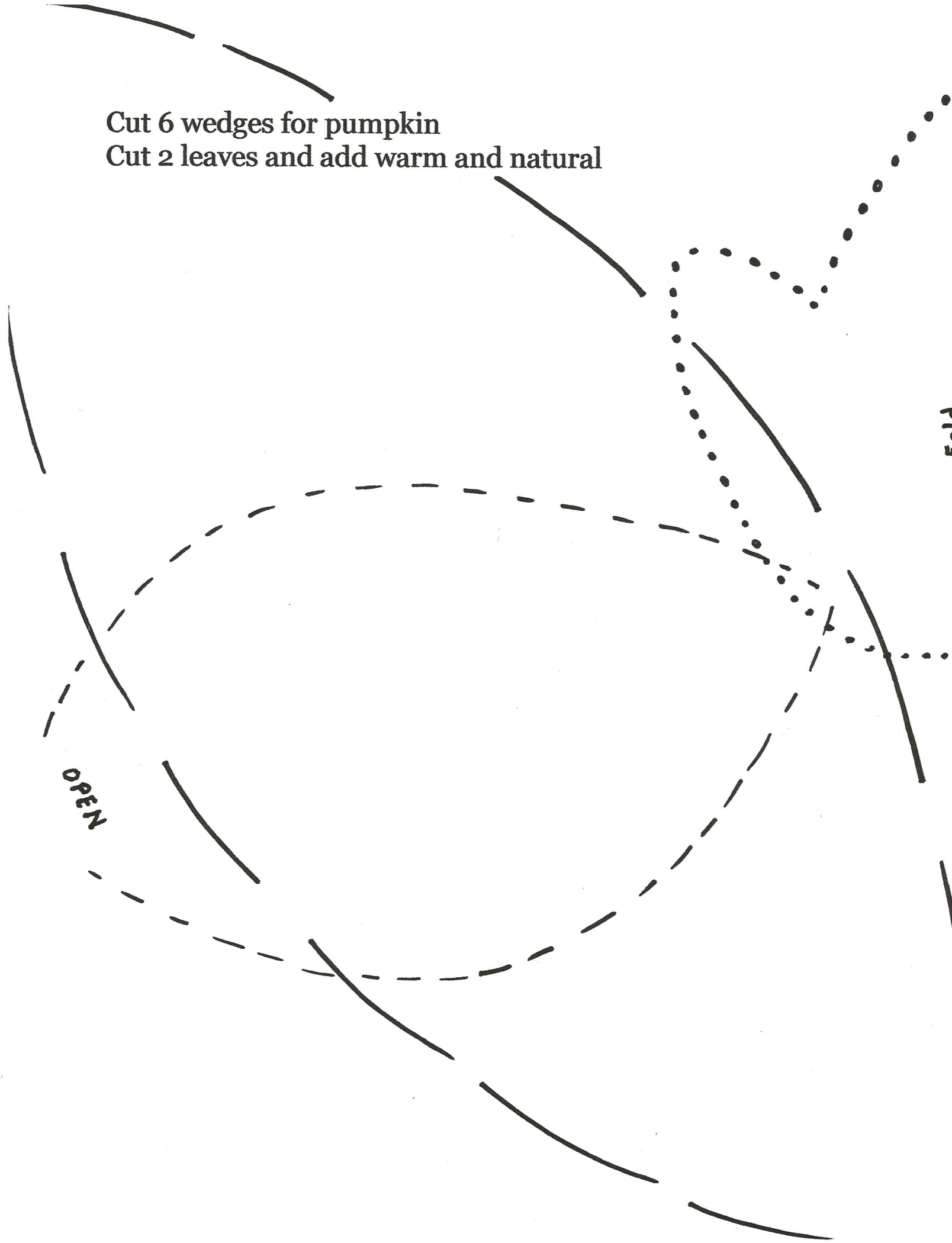
2-Stitch all wedges to one another. Choose one end of your pumpkin to begin stitching right at the edges and on the opposite stop about one inch from edge.

3-Turn your pumpkin right side out and stuff. Thread a long hand sewing needle with strong thread. Run a baisting stitch around opening and pull threads, knot off but don't clip thread. Pull through to the center bottom of your pumpkin to complete. I stitch the middle of pumpkin a couple of times till it pulls together like I like and knot off.

4-Cut two leaves and place right sides together. Place warm and natural under for body. Stitch and leave an opening at the bottom. Turn and top stitch if desired.

5-Now your ready to glue on the leaf and place a piece of wood on for the stem. Make lots and enjoy.
