### MAYOR MESSAGE

Spring is finally here! Secondary water will be turned into the system around the 16th of the month. As we have experienced a short snowfall this winter I ask that you do your very best to be conservative as you water your lawns and gardens. Please familiarize yourselves with the watering ordinance (no outside watering between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 6:00p.m.) and find ways to be proactive in protecting this most precious resource. There are many ways to conserve such as fixing leaky faucets, using slow flow devices in your taps and making sure water is not running while you are brushing your teeth or washing dishes. As you find new ways to be creative and conserve water please feel free to share them with us by posting them on our Facebook or Instagram page. This month we will be celebrating Arbor Day. Ferron City has participated in Arbor Day Celebrations for several years and if you have not participated in the past I invite you to join us. This year we will be planting trees at the Cemetery. The festivities will begin on April 21st at 9:00 am. In conjunction with the celebration we are sponsoring our annual poster contest. Rules can be found on our website. The contest winners from last year were able to take home cash prizes and were also able to select a tree to plant at their home. The contest is open to all school age children.

Last month we honored Rex Funk as an outstanding citizen for his contributions to our city. Rex has taken it upon himself for the past several years to clean up trash as he has walked the streets of our city. He has also cleaned up at the fairgrounds around the dumpsters when they have been overflowing and has used his own resources to take care of weeds along the city sidewalks. His quiet often unnoticed service has been a great asset to the city and its citizens and I am thankful that we are blessed to have citizens in our community that serve quietly, looking out for the needs of others. ## CEMETERY INFO

Now that the mowing season is upon us, we remind residents that, in consideration of the city workers, please take notice in placing artificial flowers, wires or other items on graves that might in some way interfere with the mowing of the grass.

Items left on graves can create hazards for cemetery workers and make it difficult to maintain the plots. Floral pieces or displays left on any grave shall be removed ten (10) days after original placement, except in emergency. Those displays left on the base of the headstone will not be removed.

Please remember that private landscaping in the cemetery is against city ordinances.

## 5-1-10: DOGS AT LARGE; PENALTY FOR VIOLATION:

C. Declared Nuisance: Any dog running at large in violation of the provisions of this section is hereby declared to be a nuisance and a menace to the public health and safety, and the dog shall be taken up and impounded as provided in this chapter. (1979 Code § 13-244)

Good weather brings walking dogs. Remember the leash law. Don't let your dogs run in other people's yard while you are walking them. Please be respectful of others.

## BURN WINDOW

The burn window will continue through May 30<sup>th</sup>. Permits are still being issued through our website, [www.ferroncity.org](http://www.ferroncity.org), or by coming into City Hall. Please remember to have water available when burning.

## SPRING CLEANUP

- There will be roll-off dumpsters placed around the city in April for your spring cleanup needs.
- Please do not use dumpsters at the school, care center, senior citizens, etc. They are for their use only.
- If the dumpsters are full, please take your debris to the landfill in Castle Dale or call City Hall to have them emptied and wait to put your debris in until there is room.
- If you have tree limbs or bushes, please cut them up so they will fit down inside the dumpsters.
