If you see **street lights out**, you can report it on our website, ferroncity.org.

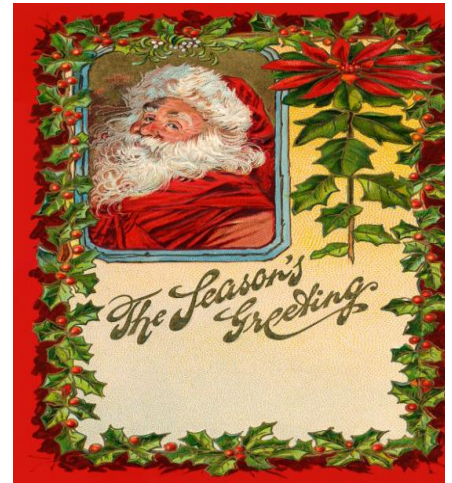
Please **do not scrape the snow** around your homes into the streets.
