BUILDING PERMITS & ZONING

Just a reminder on building permits and zoning concerns. According to the International Residential Code R105.1 a building permit is required for "any owner or authorized agent who intends to construct, enlarge, alter, repair, move, demolish or change the occupancy of a building or structure, or to erect, install, enlarge, alter, repair, remove convert or replace any electrical, gas, mechanical or plumbing system, the installation of which is regulated by this code, or to cause any such work to be done, shall first make application to the building official and obtain the required permit".

Please call city hall if you are doing any building projects to see if a building permit is required and that the proper zoning rules are followed.
