MAYORS MESSAGE

I can hardly believe how much snow we have been blessed with this winter and I am sure that most of you are like me and experiencing a bit of cabin fever and will be happy when we see the grass turning green and the leaves on the trees. I thank you all for your patience with us as we have tried to remove snow from the roads. It is a daunting task especially when the snow just keeps coming. I appreciate the city maintenance crew for trying their best to get the job done and to citizens who have assisted their neighbors by cleaning sidewalks and driveways. We recently updated an ordinance related to parking on curbs and city streets. We have had a problem with this in the past. The Planning Commission reviewed the current ordinance and made recommendations to the City Council who in turn made the appropriate changes. You can find the ordinance in its entirety on the website and posted at city hall. Basically, we are asking that everyone look at their property and remove any nonworking vehicles that may be parked along the curb, on city right of ways or on streets. These vehicles make it difficult to remove snow. They also obstruct the view at intersections, and many are just plain unsightly and lead to nuisances on property. We want to make an effort to beautify our city and make it a beautiful welcoming place and a city we can all be proud to live in. We appreciate your efforts in complying with this ordinance. If you have questions regarding the ordinance, please do not hesitate to contact city hall.

Last council meeting we discovered that the county will now be changing to a vote by mail system. This will affect our city elections. At the next meeting, we will be deciding if Ferron will go to a vote by mail system or back to the paper ballot system. This will be a big change for us. Our city recorder has also posted the notice for council positions. There will be a 2-year position and three 4-year positions to fill this fall. I would encourage you to think of running for one of these positions. Questions regarding the positions can be directed to the City Recorder. We need your help, ideas and strength as we look to the future.

BURN WINDOW

The burn window will open on March 1st through May 30th. Please remember to get a burn permit before burning. There is no charge for the permit. You can receive a permit by going to the city website, www.ferroncity.org (click on the city documents tab).

It will link you to the Utah Air Quality web page where you fill out the permit. If you are unable to do the permit on your own, please call or come to city hall and we will be happy to help you.

It is important that you have a permit. If you do not have one and your fire gets away from you, you may be responsible for any costs incurred in fighting the fire.

Notice is hereby given that a Municipal Election for Ferron City will be held this year, on November 5, 2019 to elect persons to the following offices:

One (1) Council Member – 2-year term

Three (3) Council Members – 4-year term each

A Candidate Guide to the Elections is available at the office of the City Recorder during the City's regular business hours. Candidates must be a United States Citizen, a registered voter of Ferron City, and must have resided in Ferron for a period of 12 consecutive months preceding the date of the election.

A declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition must be filed in person with the City Recorder, at 20 East Main Street, Ferron, Utah between the hours of 8:30 am and 5:00 pm beginning June 3, 2019 and ending June 7, 2019 UCA 10-3-301.
