## MAYOR MESSAGE

Welcome May! Although April showers usually bring May flowers I think that at least for myself, I can say that April winds brought red eyes, countless sneezes and plenty of dirt in places that it wasn't before. The dry weather makes me even more anxious to get watering my lawn and get my garden planted yet, I worry about the effects of the short water year which has been both a blessing and a boon. Fortunate for those working on the Millsite Dam project, the weather has been almost ideal. When you look at the massive amounts of concrete that has been poured, it could not have happened if we had experienced a normal winter. Lack of winter snow does not help our summer water plans though. As we begin the season I would like to remind all of you to be careful and remember that our water is a precious resource. If we are all conscious of our individual needs, I believe we will have the water that is necessary to see us through. At the beginning of the season while it is still cool you will not need to water as much. A small amount is all that is needed to keep things alive. As the days become hotter, remember to water during the cooler part of the day, early in the morning or late in the evening, being careful not to leave the water on for longer periods of time than is necessary. Cutting grass at a higher than normal level also helps to lessen the amount of water that is needed to keep it thriving. Please be courteous with your neighbors and gently remind them if they have left water running outside of the normal schedule or contact city hall if you see something of great concern. Working together, I believe we can be conservative enough to see the season through.

Last Council meeting we honored two great citizens of Ferron/Molen. Sid and Sherrie Swasey were chosen as the Employee and Citizen of the quarter. Sid has been employed with the city for 16 years and is always willing to perform any task given him. He has a great sense of humor and has a unique way of making people feel at home when they are around him. He is a great friend to all and goes the extra mile to help those in need. 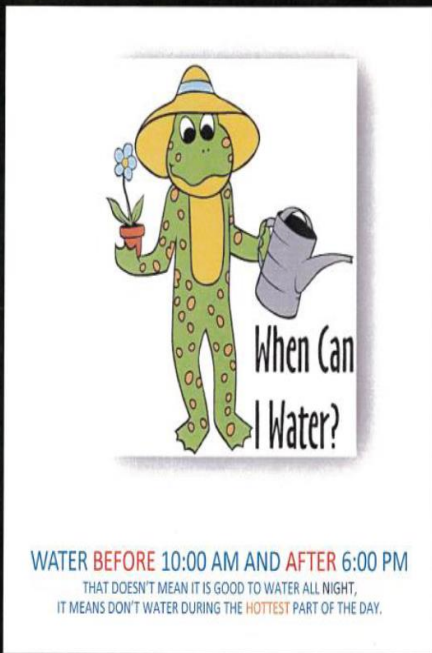


## CEMETERY REMINDERS

Please remember that:

- The speed limit in the cemetery is 5 m.p.h.
- No trailers of any kind are allowed in the cemetery. Please park them in the parking lot on the north of the cemetery.
- Articles left for decoration must be placed out of the way of the weed-eater or risk being destroyed.
- Artificial flowers found lying around, not on a grave, are not for anyone to take. They belong to the people that put them there. Please do not take them.
- No alcoholic beverages are allowed on cemetery grounds.
- If walking in the cemetery for exercise, please be respectful and teach your children to have that same respect for the people that are buried and their families that have placed flowers or mementos on their graves.

Memorial Day flowers are to be removed 10 days after the holiday.
