I suggest that each of us consider how much we really need to use and adjust our outdoor watering schedules accordingly. In addition, water conservation can and should take place inside our homes as well. By using low flow showerheads and faucets, turning off water when brushing teeth and rinsing dishes in a sink of water rather than a running stream of water in the sink, we can decrease our water consumption. Water conservation helps all of us enjoy a prolonged supply of secondary water throughout the season, sustaining our crops until the time of harvest. If you need tips or advice, please give us a call and we can help you find the resources you will need to assist you in your water conservation efforts. We realize tight watering schedules can be difficult for some, but we thank you for your support and help as we forge through the summer together.

## CEMETERY REMINDERS

Please remember that:

- ❑ The speed limit in the cemetery is 5 m.p.h.

- ❑ Artificial flowers found lying around, not on a grave, are not for anyone to take. They belong to the people that put them there. Please do not take them.
- ❑ No alcoholic beverages are allowed on cemetery grounds.
- ❑ If walking in the cemetery for exercise, please be respectful and teach your children to have that same respect for the people that are buried and their families that have placed flowers or mementos on their graves.

Memorial Day flowers are to be removed 10 days after the holiday.

Notice is hereby given that a Municipal Election for Ferron City will be held this year, on November 2, 2021 to elect persons to the following offices:

One (1) Mayor – 4-year term

Two (2) Council Members – 4-year term each

One (1) Council Member – 2-year term

A Candidate Guide to the Elections is available at the office of the City Recorder during the City's regular business hours. Candidates must be a United States Citizen, a registered voter of Ferron City, and must have resided in Ferron for a period of 12 consecutive months preceding the date of the election.

A declaration of candidacy form or nomination petition must be filed in person with the City Recorder, at 20 East Main Street, Ferron, Utah between the hours of 8:00 am and 5:00 pm beginning June 1, 2019 and ending June 7, 2021 UCA 10-3-301.
