Let's get crafty with Kraft-tex! This unique material is used to make a fun woven basket. You will use a 3-thread overlock stitch, some decorative thread and hot glue for a quick-finish project. Additionally, learn how to make serger cording using a 3-thread rolled hem to add a bit of bling. You will even get some tips on how to make wire-edged ribbon.

## Supply List

1 roll Kraft-tex Hand-Dyed Prewashed (18.5" x 28.5") 1 roll per basket\*\*

Schmetz ELX705 90/14\* needles (BERNINA L890 models & Baby Lock Triumph/Ovation/Evolution models)

Schmetz Jeans 90/14 needles\* (All other overlock models) (Look in your manual to confirm the needle type!)

Maxi-Lock Stretch Thread\* – 1 cone to match ribbon fabric

Serger Thread\* – 2 cones to match Maxi-Lock Stretch Thread

Specialty Threads such as Wonderfil Spagetti, Wonderfil Fruitti, King Tut\*, Isacord\* (the varigated is great in this project!)

Serger Thread\* – 2 cones to match/blend with your specialty thread choice(s)

High Temp Mini Glue Gun

Mini Glue Sticks

White Chalk Pencil 0.9 mm with refills\*
