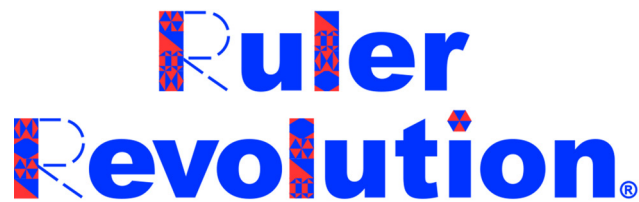


Sticks and Stones™ Rulers



"Where Speed and Accuracy Meet"

Congratulations on your selection of another revolutionary tool from Ruler Revolution that you will find useful with many patterns on the market. Using the Ruler Revolution Sticks and Stones ruler and technique, you mark the sew lines and cut lines first, sew on the larger pieces of fabric, then cut and trim. The result is a perfect rectangle block with a triangle on one or both ends that is accurate and repeatable — plus you make multiple units at one time. No bias edges

to stretch or skew and no small pieces to position and try to sew. Enjoy!

Spray starching will help stabilize the fabric, minimize loose threads along seam edges, and assist in obtaining clean, crisp cuts and sew lines

throughout the piecing process. An accurate 1/4" seam allowance is essential for all quilt piecing.

Sticks and Stones the Ruler Revolution Way

1. Select two coordinating fabrics. Cut the large piece of focus fabric either 8" wide (2" ruler) or 10" wide (2 1/2" ruler) and measuring the length of the desired un-sewn unit. See Diagram A using 2 1/2" ruler.
2. Cut the fabric for the triangle ends of the rectangle either 2" or 2 1/2" wide x 8" or 10" long, depending on which ruler you have. For example, if you have the Sticks and Stones—2 1/2" ruler, make your strip 2 1/2" wide x 10" long. For the 2" ruler, you would cut your strip 2" x 8". See Diagram A using 2 1/2" ruler.
3. Place a few dots of fabric glue (e.g. Sewline's Fabric Glue Pen) in the seam allowance area of the large fabric rectangle as shown in Diagram A. The glue dots help keep the fabric from shifting while marking -- pins are not used.
4. Position the fabric pieces right sides together for marking and sewing as shown in Diagram B.

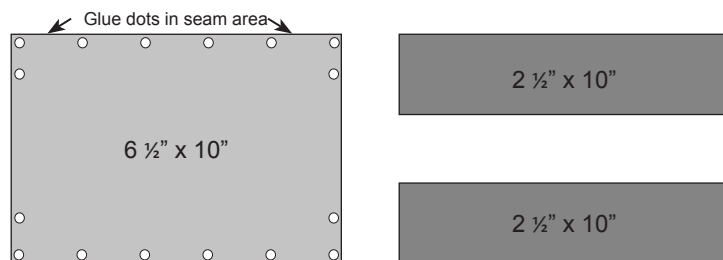
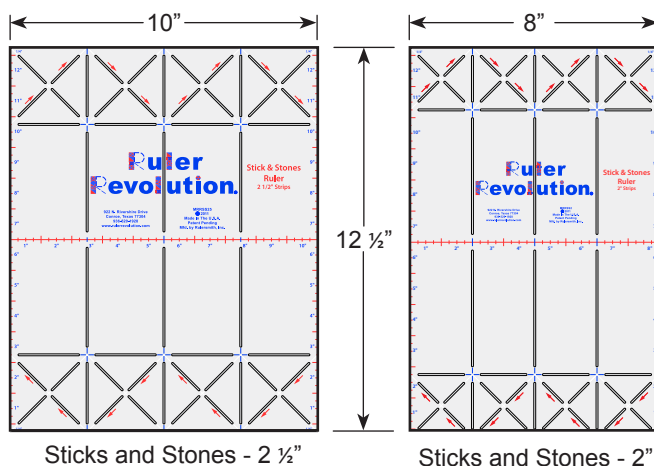

2 1/2" versus 2"

Each Ruler Revolution Sticks and Stones ruler has been designed to produce multiple un-sewn units of 2 1/2" or 2" wide and up to 12 1/2" long. For example:

- Sticks and Stones 2 1/2" — 2" finished unit.
Moda Jelly Roll and Hoffman Bali Pop friendly
- Sticks and Stones 2" — 1 1/2" finished unit

Otherwise, the technique to make the rectangle block with a triangle at one or both ends using either ruler is the same.

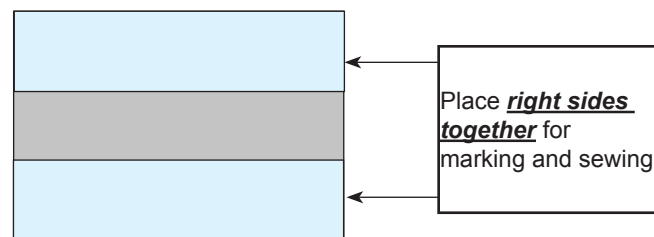

- Place the Ruler Revolution Sticks and Stones ruler on top of the fabric pieces as shown in Diagram C.
- Using a fabric marking pencil, mark a line through the slots in the ruler in each of the diagonal and vertical slots as shown in Diagram C.
- Slide the Sticks and Stones ruler up until the bottom of the ruler lines up with the bottom of the fabric and mark a line through each of the diagonal and vertical slots as shown in Diagram D.
- After marking the lines through the slots in the rulers, take the fabric stack to the sewing machine and sew straight down and on top of the diagonal lines. Turn and sew the next diagonal line. There is no need to cut the thread as you turn. DO NOT sew the vertical lines. See Diagram E.

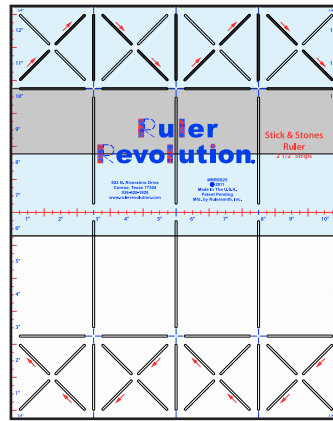

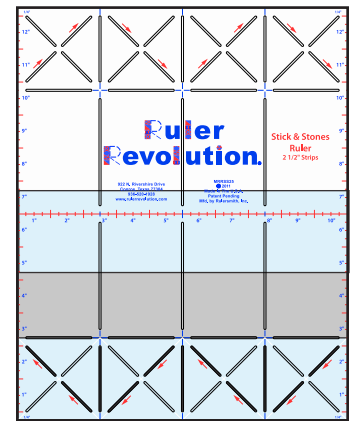

Finishing the Blocks

- Take the fabric to your cutting mat.
- Cut the four units apart using the Sticks and Stones ruler and rotary cutter following the vertical lines. See Diagram F. Note: There are blue registration marks on the ruler that will assist in lining up each cut.
- Press the triangle open toward the outside corner of the rectangle.
- Cut off the "ears" behind the corner triangles leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. The four finished Sticks and Stones units can be seen in Diagram G.

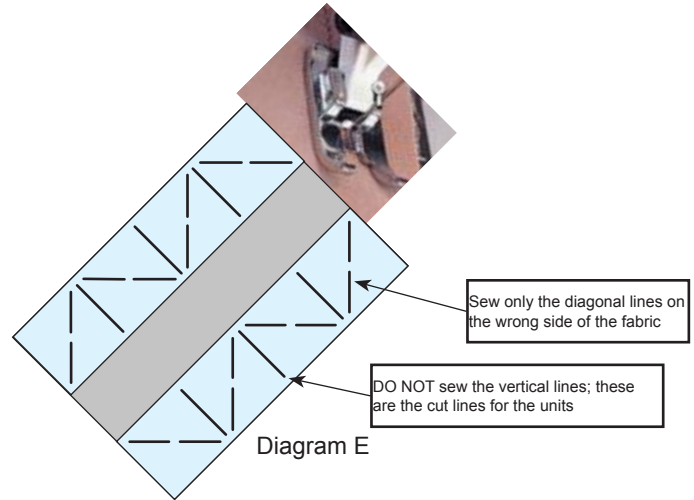

More Tips and Techniques

The Sticks and Stones ruler can also be used to make more than just 4 units at a time — very easily, accurately, and rapidly — just make longer strips and move the ruler over to mark more sew and cut lines.

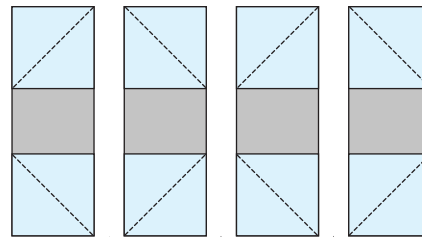

Cut units along vertical lines

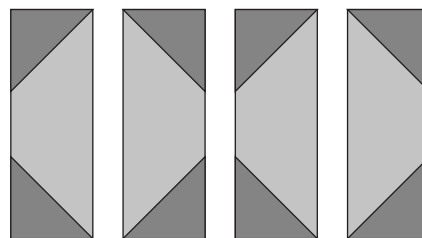

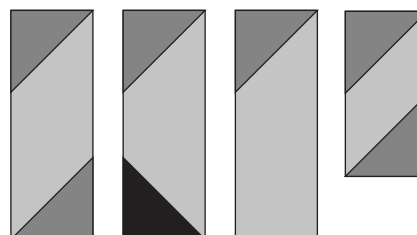
