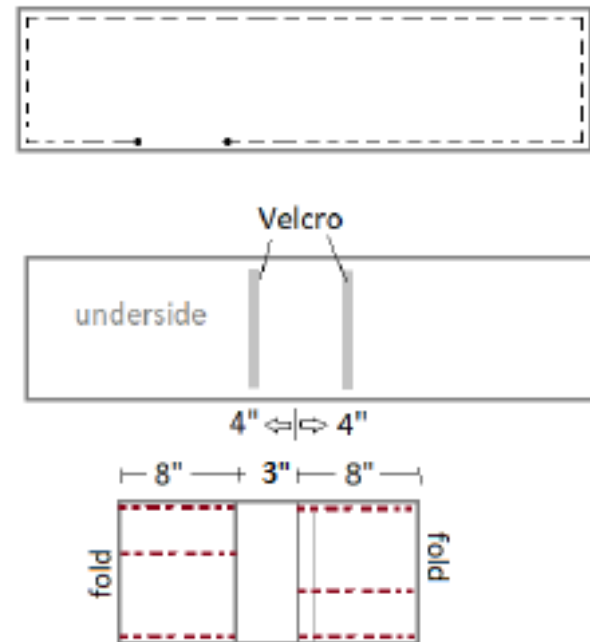


Walker Bag

1. Cut two pieces of fabric and one piece of stiff interfacing (i.e. Décor Bond), each 14" x 40" Skip the interfacing if you are using heavy fabric, such as an upholstery type.
2. Fuse interfacing to the wrong side of one of the fabrics.
3. Layer fabrics right sides together and stitch 1/2 inch from all edges, leaving an opening of 5"-6" on one of the long sides, for turning.
4. Clip corners. Press in edges of opening to line up with the stitched edges on either side of the opening.
5. Turn the unit right sides out, pushing the corners out to nice points. Tuck in the edges of the opening.
6. Top stitch 1/4 inch from all edges. 7. On the underside, find and mark the center of the unit. Sew Velcro pieces 4" from the center, and ending about 1-1/2 inches from the sides.
8. On the top side, measure in 8 inches from both short ends and mark this as the fold line. Fold the ends up on the fold line, so the underside fabric will be the pocket fronts.
9. Stitch the sides of the pockets twice, bar tacking at the top of each pocket. Stitch a dividing line on each pocket, bar tacking the top of the stitching.



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
