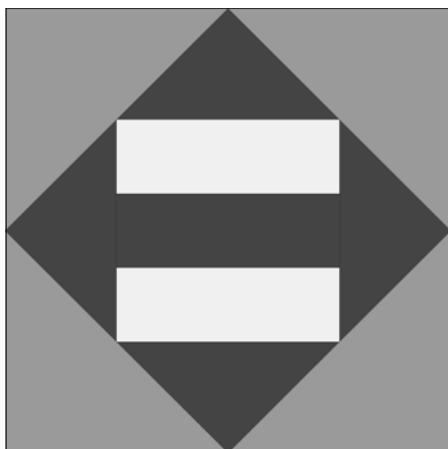






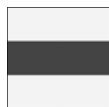
68- 2 Peter (Double Anchor)






Pattern for 6" finished block — All seams are 1/4".
Pressing directions are indicated.

Fabric needed for one block & Cutting instructions

Dark	1/8 yard or scrap (1) 4-1/4" square, cut twice diagonally (1) 1-1/2"x3 1/2" rectangle	
Medium	1/8 yard or scrap (2) 3-7/8" squares, cut once diagonally	
Light	1/8 yard or scrap (2) 1-1/2"x3" rectangles	



Instructions:

1. Begin this block by constructing the central bar unit using (2) Light rectangles and (1) Dark rectangle. Press toward the Dark rectangle.
2. Stitch Dark triangles to opposite ends of the unit from Step 1 as shown. The corners will slightly overlap (approx. 3/8") the block. Press toward the Dark triangles.
3. Stitch (2) Dark triangles to the remaining sides of the block. Press toward the Dark triangles.
4. In the same fashion, stitch (2) Medium triangles to opposite sides of the unit from Step 3. Again, the corners will slightly overlap. Press toward the Medium triangles. Stitch (2) Medium triangles to the remaining sides of the block. Press toward the Medium triangles.

It is highly doubtful that Peter authored this 2nd letter. Details in the letter indicate that it was more likely written by someone in the second century who felt deeply indebted to Peter. At that time, using the apostle's name was a method of confirming his teachings and was considered quite acceptable.

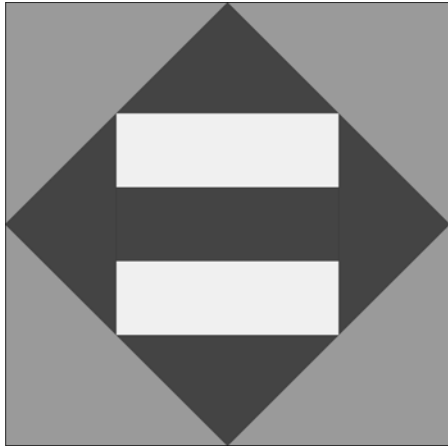

68- 2 Peter (Double Anchor)



This is Block 68 of a 73 block series representing the 39 books of the Old Testament, 7 books of the Apocrypha, and 27 books of the New Testament. I chose to name the blocks after books of the Bible as a testament to my faith. I call the finished quilt "Bible Studies." Whether Catholic or Protestant, I hope each block will have a special meaning to the quilt maker. For me, reviewing the books of the Bible recalled many of my favorite bible stories and passages. I include a bit of Bible history for each block I have used, as a reference, the New Oxford Annotated

Bible with the Apocrypha, Revised Standard Version, 1977, an Ecumenical Study Bible.

I chose Double Anchor to represent 2 Peter because the short letter has a double purpose: to strengthen faith in the second coming of Christ and to guard against false teachers.
