

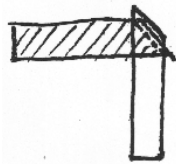
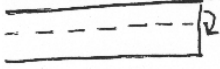
# 9 Pane or Window Pane pillow

## Finishing Instructions

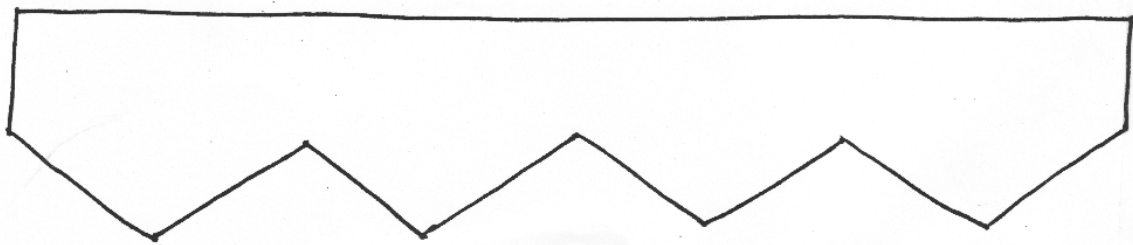

(Your 12" strip of fabric is your "main" fabric, the 9" strip is your "coordinating" fabric)

- Cut stitched piece 1½ inches from the edge of the stitching
- Cut (2) 1"x9" pieces of coordinating fabric (set aside)
- Cut (2) 4"x9" pieces of coordinating fabric. Fold each piece in half lengthwise (right sides together) and iron. Lay the pattern (at the bottom of the instruction sheet) on the fabric and trace it on with a thin black marker.
- Sew along traced lines (leaving a space to turn the fabric right side out). Trim and clip edges
- Turn right side out and iron. Repeat the last three steps with the second folded piece of fabric.
- Lay the flat edge of the pointy pieces of fabric against the top and bottom edges of the stitched piece and sew using a ¼" seam. (the points should lay about ¼" away from the stitching)
- Sew a 1"x9" strip to each of the sides of your stitched piece (not the top and bottom)
- Cut (4) 2½" strips of main fabric (if using a striped fabric, cut on the diagonal)
- Sew the top and bottom first by laying your main fabric on the coordinating fabric (right sides together). Turn over and stitch from the back with the edge of your presser foot along the previous seam. Trim and iron. Do the same on the sides. Trim and iron.



- Trim your entire piece so it measures 10"x10"
- To make piping, cut (6) 1½" strips on the diagonal out of the coordinating fabric. Sew strips together.
- Measure piping around pillow, cut.
- Lay piping inside fabric and sew down the side using your zipper foot.
- Attach the piping to the pillow using your zipper foot as well.
- Cut a 10"x 10" piece of backing fabric from the main fabric. Sew onto the pillow leaving an opening for stuffing.
- Turn pillow right side out and stuff.
- Whipstitch closed
