Anjanette moved to approved the minutes. Eric seconded.

**Concert** needs for tomorrow night: Mike Leger will be doing the sound. Wayne Eckman would like to go first.

Lucile: Susie Carter would like to do a concert with her sister in March.

Heather: The Young Artist/elementary school program was a great success. It was a good idea to merge community with the elementary school for the Young Artist program. They will want to tweak a few things. The goal is to help people enjoy the arts and be interested in staying the whole evening.

Lucile: The variety of entertainment was fabulous! It was a distraction to have people going in and out for food. It would be good to have door monitors to keep people from coming and going during [a] performance.

Anjanette: Some people felt there could be less dialog in between numbers.

The school was able to raise \$700.00 from the auction/food sales.

Debbie: Could the Arts Council match the funds to contribute to the schools goal of \$3000.00?

Lucile: Do we have the money to do that this year? Debbie will check into it.

Lucile invited Heather to consider bringing a school class over from time to time to see the art in the council room.

The elementary school has been concerned that the bowery behind city hall will be removed. It has been in demand for a lot of occasions by people in the city. Mayor Romney said 'no' the bowery will not be taken down. The roof leaks. It will be remodeled/changed. The next city council meeting will be May 21. Heather and AnJanette should discuss their concerns with the city council. James feels they would be open to what they have to say.

### Independence Day

Lucile: The Arts Council will be paying for the sounds guy for Endless Summer concert.

### **Clown School**

Shelly: Has made arrangements for a Clown school. They suggested advertising for "The Young and Young at Heart" with no age limit. The arts council discussed making the age limit 10 years and older. It was recommended the last 2 Thursdays of June on the 20th and 27th. The cost will be \$400. Registration for students should be \$20.00. Students can make balloon creations at the park on the 4th for tips.

### **Games**

Emily is arranging for 10 games. Some are Plinko, ducky pond, pull back cars, bean bag toss, (we need new bean bags) ring toss,

fish pond. The sucker pull could be improved. New additions would be balloon darts and boat races. Debbie suggested something like a cake walk or cookie walk without cakes. (Email: Emily is looking into a cupcake walk and asking if Dick's Market will donate the cupcakes.)

Emily is arranging for a tent for each game and aprons for the people operating the games. The children can be given a bag with their tickets. They can carry their prizes in their bags. Tickets will be available from 11:30 am to 1:30 pm. The games will be closed at 2:00 pm.

Debbie's mother will take care of the tickets. It was suggested 750 bags should be made.

Lucile: Eric has done a lot of investigation about a dunk tank. It would be much cheaper to rent than to make. There was discussion about the mud that would be created around the tank and who would use the tank. We should probably wait until next year to discuss it again.

## **Once Around**

James: City Council has discussed allotting more money to the Arts Council. None of the City Council had any objections.

Anjanette: Had thank you notes with envelopes made. She also made musical staff earrings for the girls and tie tacks for the boys who participate in the Young Artist program. The cost was \$35.00.
