CITY FALL CLEAN-UP 2018

The city will provide large bins in the north parking lot of West Bountiful City Park (off 1890 N) for Fall Clean-up again this year. West Bountiful residents will be allowed to dispose of yard waste, scrap metal and miscellaneous clean-up materials from their primary place of residence. Proof of address will be checked.

* Please take Hazardous Material Waste to Wasatch Energy Recovery Facility in Layton.

** Please take Green Waste to Bountiful Landfill. It is accepted there year-round – but the city will cover the cost during our clean-up period.

Unwanted Solicitation

West Bountiful City is concerned with the litter and waste caused by the local delivery of the Shop Now advertisement (it is wrapped as a newspaper and thrown in front of homes), and the city needs your help. The next time the ad is delivered, you can help the city by contacting us if any of the following are the case:

- 1) It is laying in the street or sidewalk (it didn't make it all the way to your property).

- 2) It was delivered onto your property even if you have a "no solicitors" sign posted.
- 3) It was delivered onto your property even if you have previously asked the company to stop.
- 4) It was delivered to a vacant home near you.

If any of those apply to you, snap a picture, send it to recorder@wbcity.org, and include your address. You can also send any questions you have to the email address.

Secondary Water Info

NO WATERING BETWEEN 10 am and 6 pm! Secondary irrigation (Weber) water will be shut off for the season the week of October 15. The main control valve in your park-strip can be left in the open position so that any water left in your lines may drain into the main lines in the street.

Winter Reminders

- **Sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of each snowfall** and remember that all snow from your property **must remain on your property** and not in the street or your neighbor's property.
- **Adopt a Hydrant.** Please shovel around any fire hydrants near your property so they are easily visible and accessible in case of emergency.
- Keep your **trees and shrubs trimmed** so the snow plows can make their way through the city. Trees are required to be trimmed to 14 feet above the roadway. If city crews find trees that do not meet this height, they will trim the trees.
- **Overnight parking is not permitted** on streets from **November 15 through April 1**. An exception will be made 2 days before and after Thanksgiving and Christmas.
- Parking on the street is **not allowed at any time**, regardless of day, **when snow is visibly falling**, or there is a visible amount of snow on the street and the street has not been plowed since the snow fell.

Senate, House Seats to be Decided Nov. 6



A General Election is being held on November 6 to fill 1 U.S. Senate seat, 2 U.S. House seats, and various state and county seats. Voters can register up to 7 days before the election online, or in-person at the County Clerk's office. Mail-in ballots will be sent to all registered voters about 3 weeks before the election and can be returned by mail, at a drop box (city hall), or you can vote in person on election day at city hall between 7 am and 8 pm.



From the Chief: Communication is the Key to Success

I know this has already been in the newsletter, however, it is always great to have a refresher on how to make it easier for those requiring assistance. A simple list below can be used as a guide.

West Bountiful City Police Department

Business Office 801-292-4487

Hours are 8 am to 5 pm Monday – Thursday
and on Friday 8 am to 3 pm

When to call the police business office: If you need copies of police reports, fingerprints, or any administrative type of business. This is the number you should call. If you wish to speak with an officer or want to report a crime that has occurred prior you can come into the office and request to speak with an officer during business hours. If you want an officer to call you or come to your house or a specific location keep reading below.

Police, Fire, and EMS needs:

Non Emergency 801-298-6000, Emergency 911

Dispatch center is open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week

When to call dispatch: If you need any fire, emergency medical services (EMS), or a police officer you

should call our dispatch center directly. For example, if you need a police officer to come to your house or call you regarding a crime either in progress or committed prior, or any other service need that you require assistance from the police.

In order to be as effective as possible, we suggest you follow the examples above. Although, if you call the police department administrative office, and you need to report an incident, we will be happy to transfer you to our dispatch center.

In addition to what number(s) you should call, I believe it is more important to stress that you should call us. We are here to help; you are not bothering us; don't feel stupid; and if it is something we can't help with, maybe we can guide you in the right direction. Our dispatch center has trained professionals working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week ready to take your calls, answer questions, and send you the help you need.
