### HollyFrontier Refinery Reports to Council

After a month that included problems with false alarms and then a fire, Refinery Manager Scott White appeared before the West Bountiful City Council on January 15, 2019 to make a report on the status of the refinery.

Mr. White began by apologizing for the false alarms and the concerns they caused in the community. He explained the alarms were caused by water seeping into a remote activation button, and that the

## Water-wise Irrigation Tips

### 1. Respond to Your Lawn's Need, Not Your Habit!

Your lawn will adapt easily to an every three-day watering pattern. If nature helps out, so much the better! Check to see if rainfall is meeting your lawn's needs. Here's a tip: let nature sprinkle your lawn as late into spring as possible before you begin to irrigate, and you'll be helping your lawn develop healthy roots. To determine if your lawn is getting enough water, try sticking a screwdriver in the ground. If it goes in too easily, cut back on watering. If it's a struggle to get it in, increase watering.

### 2. Don't Water Everything the Same

Water the lawn separately from plant beds and trees because these areas need less water than the lawn.

### 3. Water by the Light of the Moon

Watering at night alone will reduce evaporation loss by up to 20 percent. Because our climate is typically dry, this practice won't create mildew or fungus on your lawn unless you water too much.

## Free Water Check

Want a customized irrigation schedule for your landscape? Want to know what type of soil you have and how to make your irrigation system more efficient? Get a free water check and you will learn how to efficiently water your landscape so you can have an attractive landscape while saving water and money!

An audit is much simpler than you may think: a full system audit can be accomplished in about an hour. You can pick up a free set of 12 catch cups from Bountiful Irrigation District. There are easy-to-follow instructions included with the catch cup kit as well as informative videos on [www.wateringschedule.com](http://www.wateringschedule.com)

If a system is maintained, a catch cup test performed, and the timer schedule implemented, the average yard will use approximately 108,000 gallons for a total watering savings of 151,200 gallons! And your lawn will still be healthy and green.

problem has been corrected.

Just days after the false alarms were corrected, the community heard an alarm at 10:30am on January 10th related to an actual fire on a reformer unit. The South Davis Metro Fire Agency and the West Bountiful Police Department assisted with this event. While any fire at the refinery is serious, this incident was relatively small, and HollyFrontier is conducting a full investigation into its cause.

Mr. White and city officials stressed that the refinery's alarm is not intended to act as an alarm for the community. Emergency responders such as the fire or police departments will contact residents when there are community emergencies, but each family is encouraged to be prepared with their own plans in case of natural disasters or other emergency events.

Mayor Romney, the City Council, and members of the community in attendance discussed with Mr. White the importance for good communication and good coordination between the refinery and emergency responders.



## Weed Abatement Info

We love the beautiful spring and summer weather we have in West Bountiful, but with it comes something we don't love - WEEDS. Please keep the weeds in your yard maintained, and if you own a vacant lot please check your property often to make sure they do not become a problem. For more information, check out West Bountiful's Nuisance Ordinance, Section 8.12 in the Municipal Code on the city website. If properties fall into violation and are not addressed after being noticed, fines of \$100 per day may be assessed.



## FEMA Flood Maps Available to Review



The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has the responsibility of assisting individuals and communities in the event of natural disaster. Besides assisting in the aftermath of such disasters, FEMA also has the responsibility to evaluate flooding potentials. The flood potential from natural drainages is shown on Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRM) for the more developed areas across the United States, including our community. The FIRM maps are available for review at WB City Hall and at any Davis County Library. Anyone interested in reviewing the FIRM maps can contact the city.
