Help us light up the city. If you notice a street light is out, or lights at the park need to be replaced, please report it to the city at 801-292-4486. Thanks!

Seasonal Reminder

- Sidewalks must be cleared within 24 hours of each snowfall, and remember that all snow from your property must remain on your property and not in the street or your neighbor's property.
- Adopt a Hydrant. Remember to shovel around any fire hydrants near your property so they are easily visible and accessible in case of emergency.
- Keep your trees and shrubs trimmed so the snow plows can make their way through the city. Trees are required to be trimmed to 14 feet above the roadway.
- Overnight parking is not permitted on streets from Nov. 15 through Apr. 1. An exception will be made 2 days before and after a Holiday.
- Parking on the street is not allowed at any time, regardless of day, when snow is visibly falling, or there is a visible amount of snow on the street, and the street has not been plowed since the snow fell.

General Election Information

Citizens can register to vote and review candidate information at www.Vote.Utah.gov. Ballots will be mailed three weeks before the November 8 Election. Ballots may be returned by mail or brought to the ballot box at city hall. If preferred, voters can come to city hall on Election Day to vote.



From Founders to Friends

For a past Founders Day celebration, Eric Eastman penned the following about those who settled West Bountiful beginning in 1848.

"... Those who came brought families and fun,
"Talent and businesses and one by one,
"They forged their way making this their home...
"... At City Hall each 2nd Friday we meet,
"Talents to celebrate and friends to greet..."

How true it is. Please join us Sept. 9 as we celebrate Founders Day bringing two talented, long time "friends" of this community to center stage. Wayne Eckman, who has run his own successful business, came 29 years ago with his



wife Julie and raised their three children here. He will play and sing traditional accordion favorites like Lady of Spain, polkas, Italian/French melodies, as well as Broadway musicals and music from the 1920's through the 1980's.

John Trimming, artist extraordinaire, and his wife Norma came here in 1977 and raised four children. A teacher for 37 ½ years at Woods Cross High School and Kailua High School in Hawaii, John is now retired but still continues to paint and wow us with his work. Some of his paintings are on display in the city hall council chambers. As John takes the stage he will share insights and stories about his paintings .

400 N Construction

Work came to a stop for a short while on the Bountiful 400 North road project between Main St. and 500 West. During the inspection, the project team identified concerns with the grade/slope of the new concrete pavement. They determined that if it were left uncorrected, future drainage issues may result and the newly constructed section may not be level with local streets. Work has resumed. Phase 2 (500 West – I-15) will continue until early September; concrete pouring will occur at night. For current information, visit udot.utah.gov/go/400north.



Where Did Summer Go?

School is back in session. The clothes shopping is done, backpacks are filled with supplies, and excitement is everywhere!

What should we do to make sure not only our own kids are safe, but all kids are safe?

1. Slow down while driving; kids are excited and not paying as close attention to their surroundings as they should. School zones are 20 mph.
2. Look around, use caution when pulling into or leaving a driveway. It is amazing how fast a child can get behind your vehicle.
3. If you see a school bus with flashing yellow lights, it means they are preparing to stop to either pick up or drop off students; red means stop. We are conditioned to drive past vehicles as we go down the road and not think much about it. Tell yourself "watch for school busses" prior to driving until we get reconditioned to having them around.
4. If your children walk to school it may help them to have you walk with them once or twice. This will help them feel more confident and will give you the opportunity to find

the best route and point out different safety concerns to them. Always walk on the sidewalk if available.

5. Children riding bikes in the bike lane need to be taught not to swerve out toward traffic and they should ride as far away from the vehicle travel lane as practical.
6. Make yourself aware of the cell phone use laws and follow them. No call, text, or email is worth killing a person for.
