

FALL MYSTERY QUILT

Clue 2

I forgot to mention last week that this pattern was developed by A. E. Nathan Fabrics and was published as a free pattern on the internet. So, thanks to A. E. Nathan Fabrics.

Block #3 – uses Fabric C and Fabric E

Fabric C – (white or lightest color)

Cut (10) 3" strips x WOF, sub-cut into (60) 3" x 3" squares Label these 3x3 B3

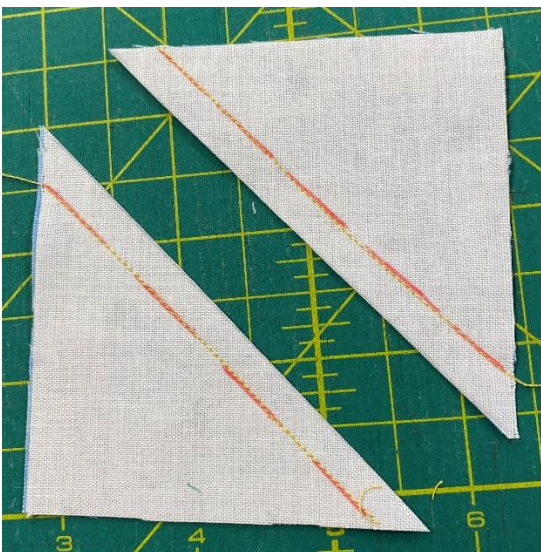
Fabric E (Medium blue)

Cut (10) 3" strips x WOF, sub-cut into (60) 3" x 3" squares – You can put these in the same bag as the 3"x3" Fabric C squares.

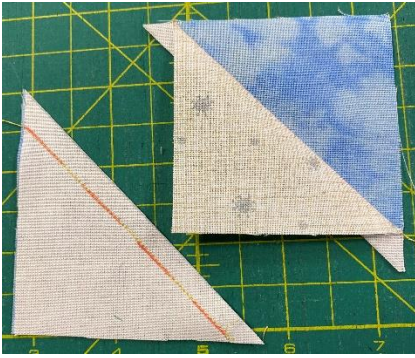
Let's make Block #3.

Layer Fabric C and Fabric E right sides together and draw a diagonal line, corner to corner, on the lighter fabric – We are making half square triangles (HST).

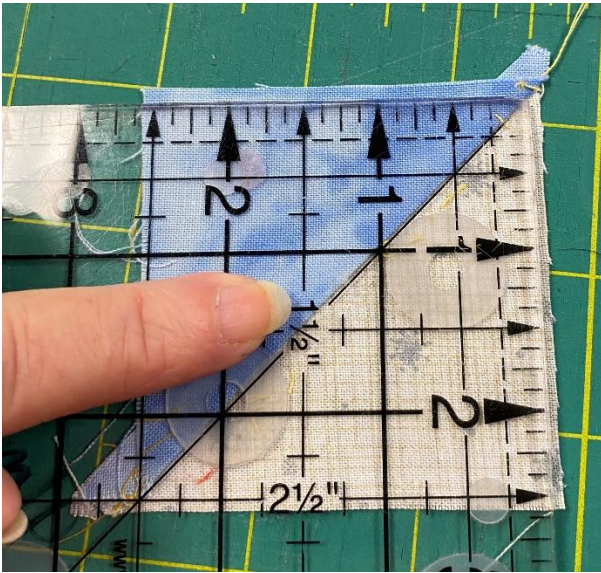
Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " from each side of the drawn line, then cut on the drawn line.



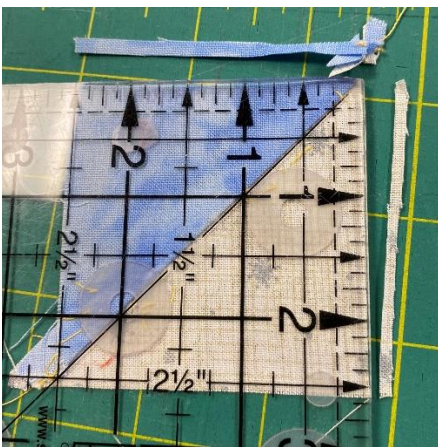
Press to the darker side. You now have 120 HST's.



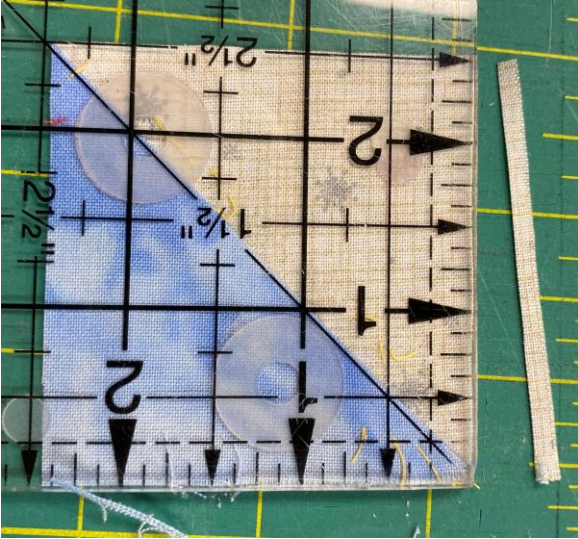
Carefully trim these HSTs to measure $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " by lining up the 45 degree line on your ruler, Trim two sides to $2\frac{1}{2}$ ".



Join four of the HST together: **Important!!! Make sure that the HST's are in the position in the photo.** The first HST is placed so the blue is at the bottom left, white at the top right, etc.



Turn the block and trim the other 2 sides to 2 ½".



Make 60. Make sure that your pinwheels are in this configuration. The top left block should have the blue on the lower left side.
