

Pen and Paper Workshop: Everbloom

This session of the Pen and Paper Workshop will focus on making a pair of echinacea from the Everbloom pattern.

In the Pen and Paper workshops, you are welcome to work on other Pen and Paper patterns, provided I can teach them. There is a list of the patterns I have worked with at the bottom of the supply list. If you want to work with something else, let me know and I'll look it over to see if I have used all the techniques involved in the pattern

Required Materials:

- Sewing machine in good working order (remember your foot pedal and power cord!)
- Quarter inch foot
- Rotary cutter and your favorite ruler(s)
- Pins and seam ripper
- Thread (extra bobbin is a good idea)
- Pattern: Everbloom by Pen + Paper Patterns
- Optional: A smaller ruler such as Creative Grids 2½ by 18½ (CGR218) or Creative Grids 3½ by 18½ (CGR318) (handy for small measurements)

Fabric:

Fabric requirements are listed on the pattern if you want to do a quilt

If making two flowers , you need the following:

- One 2 3/4 " by 13" strip for wings
- One 1½ " by 11" strip for tummy feathers (consider a tight stripe, look at pattern to make sure you cut the right way)
- One 2" square for pupils
- One 3" square for beak
- One 1" by 13" strip for the rest of the eye
- 1/8 yard for tummy and face
- ¼ yard for borders
- ½ yard for pillow back

Bring leftovers from cutting in case of mistake!
