

Dresden Table Runner

In this class we will make some traditional Dresden Plate blocks and create a quick table runner. We will use a charm pack and machine applique so that it's a quick and easy project. You don't have to have any applique experience or have done the Dresden Plate block before.

Required Materials:

- A charm pack, or 33 individual 5" squares from your scraps/stash (30 for the plates and 3 for the center circles)
- 1/2 yard of background fabric, subcut into three 13.5" squares
- A small amount of light weight iron-on stabilizer (approx. 5" x 15")
- 2/3 yard of backing fabric and 1/4 yard of binding fabric
- Quilt batting approx. 15" x 44" for quilting (this is a good time to use leftovers)
- Dresden wedge ruler
- Sewing machine with power cord and foot pedal. Don't forget a new needle for a new project!
- Cutting tools – rotary cutter or scissors, with your favorite ruler. There are cutting mats to use in the classroom.
- Sewing notions – pins, seam ripper, thread snips/scissors, thread for piecing. Bring a thread color for the applique that goes with your charm pack – it will show in the finished project.
- A wooden or plastic point turning tool
- Erasable fabric marking pen/pencil – I like the Flexion pens but you can use a pencil or water soluble pen if you like – we need to trace and cut out the circles.

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
