

Amethyst Project Bag

Short Description: A terrific sized bag to carry your project to class, to a retreat or just to store within your sewing room.

Long Description: This bag features ample storage space for any project or hobby—quilting, drawing, hand sewing or so much more! The lining features a zippered pouch, mesh zippered pocket and elastic for holding pens or other items. The bottom of the case has an elastic buckle strap to hold quilt blocks, books, and rulers.

Finished size: 14" long x 13" high x 3" deep

Pattern—Amethyst Project Bag by Sew Sweetness

Pattern, mesh, 14" zippers, 40" double pull zippers, elastic & fabrics can be purchased at Gigi's Fabric Shop.

You will be responsible for purchasing the parachute buckle on your own.

Materials Needed (as written on the pattern)

Exterior Panels	¾ yard
Lining Fabric	1 yard
Soft and Stable	½ yard
Fusible Woven Interfacing Pellon SF 101 – 20" wide	2 yards

Peltex 71F	1 ½ yards ** see note below** (start with 1 yard)
40" Handbag double pull zipper	
9" and 14" (or 2 – 14") zippers	

Other Materials:

Package of mesh (piece 14 ½" x 5")

½ yard ¼" elastic

1 yard of 1" wide elastic (fold over elastic) ****I didn't use this.

1- plastic side-release/parachute buckle (it should be able to accommodate 1" wide strap)

Supplies Needed for Day of Class:

- Sewing machine with appropriate thread, zipper foot, walking foot
- Size 14 or 16 denim or Microtex needle

- Pins, rotary cutter, rulers (6 ½ x 12 is a useful size), cutting mat for personal use
- Pencil, chalk, water soluble pen or thin marker to mark with
- Wonder clips
- X-Press It double-sided tape or ¼" Steam-a-Seam (very helpful with installing zippers)
- Pressing cloth

All classes are supported by fabric purchases at Gigi's. A 10% discount will be provided for all class materials. Please do not bring in fabrics purchased outside of Gigi's. This is how we keep our doors open. We appreciate your support.

HOMEWORK....It is recommended to complete this before the day of the class to help ensure you finish the Amethyst Project bag the day of the class. There may be additional work in between in necessary.

You will be cutting out all the pieces needed and fusing the interfacings to the corresponding fabric before class begins. As you cut each piece, pin a label to the fabric. Hint: write the interfacing/size used on the label that corresponds with the fabric piece. Trace the pattern piece for the Corner onto freezer paper. This will make it easier to transfer onto the fabric later when you need to. You can iron the freezer paper onto the fabric. You may wish to number the pages on your pattern to make it easier to follow your pre-work instructions. Cutting instructions is page 1.

You will be learning how to measure and cut fabrics & stabilizers, install zippers, sew with mesh by making a mesh zippered pocket, sew with elastic, and install side release buckle/parachute to the bottom of the bag, sew around curves and continue to develop your skills of reading patterns.

Read through the directions on the pattern to familiarize yourself with the information.

The table below will assist in the cutting instructions and the corresponding interfacings.

Cutting Instructions—Fabric & Interfacings: (PAGE 1)

(all cutting measurements are width x height)

It is recommended that you cut your fabric pieces in the order listed so that you will have plenty of fabric for the bag. If you plan to quilt your exterior pieces to interface, I recommend rough cutting them approximately 1" larger to account for shrinkage when machine quilting.

Let's start at the bottom of page 1:

Make a template of the corner on freezer paper. As you read through the directions, round the corners of the pieces.

Page 2: Attach the Interfacing: Follow the directions for steps 1 - 3.

Bring with you all your pieces and any extra fabric/stabilizers as well to class with you.

We will begin on page 3 with step 4 Make the Zipper Pouch.
