Short Description: A casual and easy to wear tote that will feature your favorite fabrics.

Long Description: The trail tote is a lovely shaped cross body style tote bag with a round bottom that comes in two sizes. This fully lined bag features an exterior zippered pocket securely holds all those important items: keys, phone, etc. Inside you will find a sizeable slip pocket and the bag closes with a magnetic snap at the top. Edged in piping and an adjustable strap make this bag functional!

Finished size: Large 14 ½" x 15" x 2 ½" Small 10" x 10 ½" x 1 ½"

Materials Needed for the Large tote:

Fabric A Exterior	1/2 yard
Fabric B Lining	1/2 yard
Fabric C Accent (exterior zipper pocket lining & interior slip pocket)	½ yard
Fabric D Strap & Piping	³ ⁄ ₄ yard ¹ ⁄ ₂ yard if not adding piping
****I added fusible fleece to my exterior main pat- tern pieces—Pellon 987 Fusible Fleece	****1 yard
Fusible Woven SF101	2 yards
***I added SF101 to the lining main pattern pieces	**adjusted amount if using fusible

***If you are making the SMALL tote be sure to adjust the fabric amounts as needed and follow the cutting instructions in the pattern. Directions are the same to make both sizes.

Other Materials:

(1) Magnetic Snap

(2) 1 ¹/₂" rectangular D-rings and (1) 1 ¹/₂" strap slider

1 ¹/₂ yards 1/8" cotton cording for making piping (adding piping to tote is optional)

X-Press It double-sided tape or ¹/₄" Steam-a-Seam (very helpful with installing zippers)

Supplies Needed for Day of Class:

- Pattern (downloaded and **PRINTED** from link given above)
- Sewing machine with appropriate thread, zipper foot, walking foot, piping foot (optional)
- Size 14 or Microtex needle
- Pins, rotary cutter, rulers (6 ½ x 12 is a useful size), cutting mat for personal use
- Pencil, chalk, water soluble pen or thin marker to mark with
- Wonder clips
- X-Press It double-sided tape or ¹/₄" Steam-a-Seam (very helpful with installing zippers)
- Pressing cloth

All classes are supported by fabric purchases at Gigi's. A 10% discount will be provided for all class materials. Please do not bring in fabrics purchased outside of Gigi's. This is how we keep our doors open. We appreciate your support.

HOMEWORK....It is recommended to complete this before the day of the class to help ensure you finish the Trail Tote the day of the class.

On pages 10 - 12, you will find the three parts that make up one main pattern piece (for the large). Trace the pattern pieces onto freezer paper to create one template, matching the letters together. Using the one main pattern template, you will be cutting out all the pieces needed and fusing the interfacings to the corresponding fabric before class begins. You can iron the freezer paper onto the fabric (shiny side down) to assist in cutting out the exterior pattern pieces and the linings. Peel the template off after cutting out the pattern piece and iron onto the next piece of fabric. You can reuse the pattern piece repeatedly.

You will be learning how to measure and cut fabrics & stabilizers, install a zipper and a magnetic snap to the bag, make darts, sew around curves and develop your skills of reading patterns.

Read through the directions on the pattern to familiarize yourself with the information.

Before class:

Fuse the interfacing to the wrong side of the two main exterior pieces (fusible fleece) and the two main lining pieces (SF101). Fuse the one piece of interfacing (SF101) to **one** of the 9" x 9" inner slip pocket pieces.

Bring with you all your pieces and any extra fabric/stabilizers to class with you.

We will begin on page 4 with step 2 Make the Strap.
