Plover Pouch Class

Supplies You'll Need:

- Plover Pouch Pattern
- Fabric purchased at Gigis Fabric Shop
- Thread to match your fabric
- (1) 12" Zipper (Top Zipper)
- (1) 7" x Zipper (Interior Zipper)
- (2) Zipper Pulls
- (2) 5/8 Buttons
- Scissors
- Rotary cutter
- Ruler (6" x 12" or larger)
- Double-sided sewing tape
- Pins/Clips
- Frixion Pen/ Chalk

Note:

- We are not doing the "inside mesh pocket" we will be making a fabric pocket instead. Do not cut fabric for inside fabric slip pocket - we will cut it in class.

What's Provided in Class:

- White thread
- White bobbin thread
- Sewing needle

Plover Pouch Class

Fabric Requirements:

- (1) Fat Quarter - Exterior Cotton Fabric
- (10) Fat Quarter - Accent Cotton Fabric
- $\frac{1}{2}$ yard Lining Cotton Fabric
- 1 yard SF101 Interfacing
- $\frac{1}{3}$ yard Fusible Fleece
- 2/3 yd Lining Fabric (includes interior pocket)
 - Fat Quarter: If you want to coordinate front pocket if desired.
- 2 yds Fusible Woven Interfacing (Pellon SF101)
- Fusible Fleece 19x30

Preparation Prior to Class:

- Cut all fabric pieces according to the pattern for the medium size pouch.
- Fuse SF101 interfacing to the appropriate pieces as directed in the pattern.
- Fuse fusible fleece to both exterior fabric pieces.
- Label your cut pieces (optional but helpful!) to keep everything organized for class.
- Bring all zippers, hardware, and notions required for the medium size pouch.
- Bring the left over fabric and interfacing to class.

Helpful Tips:

- Label all your supplies with name tags.
- Bring a project bin to keep your fabric and notions organized.
